Support of: <u>SB 3065 SD1</u> Relating to Land Exchange

Chair Evans, Vice Chair Lowen and Members of House Committee on Water and Land:

I am Dan Nellis, Operations Director of Dole Food Company Hawai'i. We support SB 3065 SD1 that proposes an appropriation to investigate the possibility of exchanging state land for certain parcels of land currently owned by Dole Food Company, Inc., and to pay for costs of executing the exchange if appropriate state land is found.

Dole Food Company has a long history of agriculture in Hawai'i and our intent is to continue to support and promote diversified agriculture in Hawai'i. Our plan is to continue cultivation of existing pineapple, coffee and cacao crops and to continue the operation of ancillary agricultural facilities.

Dole Food Company owns several thousand acres on O'ahu—in the Central O'ahu and North Shore regions. Various acreages are currently for sale on a parcel by parcel basis and at varying prices per parcels. We are willing to further discuss the State's interest in purchasing these parcels to support the State's mandate of promoting diversified agriculture and preserving conservation lands and habitats.

Ownership of these lands could facilitate the State's mandate to conserve and protect agricultural lands, promote diversified agriculture, increase agricultural self-sufficiency and assure the availability of agriculturally suitable lands, and to protect lands that are suitable for conservation or preservation.

Identification of parcels, easements, encumbrances, conditions and sale prices per parcel or by bulk sales are specific details that need to be identified in order to move forward with any binding land transaction agreement with the State. We also need to clearly understand the State's expectation and its process of acquiring private lands.

Chair Evans and Vice Chair Lowen, and members of the committee:

The Chamber supports the intent and provides the following **comments** on S.B. No. 3065 S.D. 1, which proposes to appropriate funds to investigate the possibility of exchanging state land for certain parcels of land currently owned by Dole Food Company, Inc., and to pay for costs of executing the exchange if appropriate state land is found.

The Chamber is the largest business organization in Hawaii, representing more than 1,000 businesses. Approximately 80% of our members are small businesses with less than 20 employees. As the "Voice of Business" in Hawaii, the organization works on behalf of its members, which employ more than 200,000 individuals, to improve the state's economic climate and to foster positive action on issues of common concern.

It appears that the intent of the bill is to protect and preserve agricultural lands and lands for preserves, sanctuaries, refuges, and unique natural assets, through a land exchange; that has various State benefits.

I am Christopher Manfredi, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,832 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interest of our diverse agricultural community.

HFB is in strong support of SB 3065, SD1, which appropriates funds to investigate the possibility of exchanging state land for land owned by Dole Food Company, Inc., and for costs of executing the exchange.

HFB believes that in order for agriculture to flourish in Hawaii and reach their full potential, land availability and long-term leases at affordable and predictable lease rental rates are critical. Dear Chair Cindy Evans and Committee Members:

This testimony is to provide the support of the Wahiawa Community and Business Association (WCBA) to this bill.

The WCBA is Wahiawa's oldest community association. For over 76 years it has stood for keeping the lands between the Ko'olau and Waianae range from Wahiawa to the North Shore in agriculture.

The cooperation between the State of Hawaii and Dole Foods Inc. will allow the State to obtain approximately 20,000 acres of agricultural and conservation lands that are in either agriculture or in conservation. Much of the agricultural land is now fallow.

This bill will require that the exchange not be calculated on "acre for acre" but on the highest and best use value of the exchanged lands. Dole will acquire lands that are more suited for development.

The State will be able to more efficiently work with local farmers for long-term leases, for their access to water and for the infrastructure necessary to process agricultural goods. Furthermore, the state can apply its ample experience to protect native habitats and watersheds.

The lands between Wahiawa and the North Shore will become Hawaii's breadbasket. It will provide agricultural employment and food for Hawaii. As visitors and local families travel to and from the North Shore the will continue to see a beautiful and memorable view plane.

This is a really good deal for Hawaii. Make it happen.

In consideration of SENATE BILL 3065, SENATE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO LAND EXCHANGE

Senate Bill 3065, Senate Draft 1 proposes to appropriate funds to investigate the possibility of exchanging state land for land owned by Dole Food Company, Inc., and for costs of executing the exchange. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) has the following comments on this measure.

The Department <u>does not support</u> land exchanges of state income-producing lands or lands designated for future income production and development. The Department <u>supports</u> acquiring certain lands through the Administration's Fiscal Year (FY) 15 capital improvement project (CIP) budget request. The following parcels identified in the subject bill are priorities for watershed and native forest protection, forest reserve, recreation, hunting and access to existing state lands:

6-3-01-02 6-4-04-01 6-3-01-03 6-8-07-05 7-2-01-03 6-7-04-01 6-7-04-04 6-7-03-02 6-7-03-06 6-7-03-07

Purchase of these parcels by the State would add watershed and forest reserve lands to the public lands inventory; create unique agro-forestry opportunities on a portion of the lands; and establish additional hunting acreage and public recreation opportunities. If the land is sold to a third party,

the access agreement between the State and Dole Foods Inc. will terminate. This will result in a loss of access to manage and maintain investments to protect high priority watershed areas on state lands that have received over \$1 million dollars in state CIP funding and \$300,000 in United States Forest Service funds. This would also eliminate access to the most popular hunting area in central/north shore of Oahu, the "Poamoho Hele Loa" road, which has received a high level of political and community support.

Acquisition of the Dole lands in the upper Waimea Valley is critical for recovery of 24 listed endangered plant and animal species including the endangered Hawaiian Hoary Bat and would protect the entire watershed of Waimea Valley from the summit to the marine protected area in the bay.

The Administration's CIP request in the supplemental FY 15 budget for acquisition would enable the State to match federal funds that would significantly offset the cost to the State, and purchase portions of the land during the bulk sale opportunity.
