Re: SB 3107 RELATING TO THE STATE INSTRUMENT. Establishes and designates the ukulele as the official state instrument.

AN ERROR IN THE TEXT OF THE BILL NEEDS TO BE CORRECTED, REGARDING THE DERIVATION OF THE WORD "UKULELE".

Testimony in support of the intention of the bill but noting a need for changes to the language of the bill regarding the origin of the word "'ukulele."

The bill SB 3107 contains a misleading irrelevant statement concerning the origin of the name of the musical instrument "'ukulele." The bill says "The word 'ukulele' is translated from Hawaiian in two parts: 'uke', meaning to strike and 'lele', meaning to jump."

The Hawaiian word "uke" is not a part of the instrument's name, so the fact that "uke" means "to strike" is irrelevant. The word that is a part of the instrument's name is "uku" which means "flea." Since the 19th

Century the instrument's name "'ukulele" has referenced the concept "jumping flea." I suggest you remove the quoted portion of the bill and replace it with the following information:

Here are two authoritative sources regarding the meaning and derivation of the instrument's name "'ukulele."

1. Hawaiian Dictionary, Revised and Enlarged Edition, by Mary Kawena Pukui and Samuel H. Elbert, 1957-1986, page 366: 'ukulele. n. Ukulele. Lit., leaping flea, probably from the Hawaiian nickname of Edward Purvis, who was small and quick and who popularized the instrument brought to Hawai'i by the Portuguese in 1879. (Elbert and Knowlton, 1957.)

2. 'Olelo No'eau, Hawaiian Proverbs and Poetical Sayings collected by Mary Kawena Pukui, 1983, page 84, item # 762: He li'ili'i ka 'ukulele, naue na'e kino nui.

A flea may be small but it can make a big body squirm.

Never belittle anyone because of their small body; he may be able to do big things.

[Also has a kaona, or double metaphorical meaning, referring to the fact that the musical instrument 'ukulele is small in size like a flea, but can make Hawaiians move their big bodies in time to the rhythm.]

My name is Alan Akaka. I am the director of Ke Kula Mele Hawaii School of Hawaiian Music and a professional steel guitarist and musician. I perform with the steel guitar weekly in Waikiki and I have appeared on and made many recordings of Hawaiian steel guitar music during the past twenty years. While I play many instruments, the Hawaiian steel guitar is my primary instrument. I am also a member and a past president of the Hawaiian Steel Guitar Association (HSGA).

Ke Kula Mele Hawaii provides education and instruction in Hawaiian instruments. While I have many students learning the ukulele, guitar and upright bass, a large percentage of my school is learning how to play the Hawaiian steel guitar because of its popularity and because it is so symbolic of Hawaii and Hawaiian music. Student steel guitarists who range in age from nine years old through adult are always very popular at our semiannual public concerts and serve to help promote and perpetuate the Hawaiian steel guitar. On occasion some of these youthful steel guitarists are featured at public venues in Waikiki and other locales and at steel guitar festivals Statewide.

The Hawaiian steel guitar has its roots in Hawaii. The Hawaiian Steel guitar is not only an instrument that is indigenous to Hawaii, but is also in itself a unique way of playing that instrument which always generates an association to Hawaii and to Hawaiian music. While the ukulele is also a very popular instrument, its use is pervasive among all music genres and is not necessarily symbolic of or associated with Hawaii and/or Hawaiian music. In 2013 a song that reached number 3 on the Billboard Top 100 featured the ukulele as the song's only instrument. While this song has been used in many movie and television productions (with the exception of one Hawaii-referenced television show where it was used as background music) the productions themselves bore no reference to Hawaii or to Hawaiian music. Neither does the song itself. There is no immediate connection when hearing the sound of an ukulele to Hawaii, unless it is within context of Hawaiian music which almost always includes a Hawaiian steel guitar.

On the other hand, the unique sound of the Hawaiian Steel guitar and the art of its playing immediately conjures up images of hula dancers and palm trees, in direct association with Hawaii. Simple characteristic Hawaiian steel guitar patterns, when played with no other instrument, are immediately recognized as Hawaiian. The Official State instrument should be a symbol that is representative of and consistently associated with Hawaii.

I hereby submit my testimony in opposition to House Bill HB2573. Please reconsider your decision to make the Ukulele the Official Instrument of the State of Hawaii.

Comments: Regarding SB3107: My name is Gale Warshawsky. I am a student of Kumu Alan Akaka at Ke Kula Mele Hawaii. I learn to play ukulele and sing Hawaiian songs, and have been Kumu Akaka's student for 4 years. During that time I have had the pleasure of performing in Ke Kula Mele concerts, where I play my ukulele for Hawaiian music, and also as background ukulele music in support of the steel guitar students when they get to perform their solos and their ensemble selections. The more I heard the steel guitar, the more interested I became in that instrument, especially as the steel guitar is indigenous to Hawaii. About 2 years ago I asked Kumu Akaka if I could learn to play the steel guitar as well as continue my studies with him on the ukulele. He created a beginner's class for adults who wanted to learn to play steel guitar too. I have now had the incredible experience of playing steel guitar for one and a half years. I got to play it with the Ke Kula Mele ensemble at two of our concerts last May and last Dec. It was most exciting to play the Hawaiian steel guitar as part of the steel guitar ensemble. We had 22 steel guitar students, children through senior citizens, all playing together in the steel guitar ensemble, while the other students on ukulele, Hawaiian style bass, and guitar, played background music to support us steel guitar students. Learning how to play the Hawaiian steel guitar is challenging and rewarding. It is a very unique instrument whose roots are associated with Hawaii and Hawaiian music. Portuguese immigrants brought the ukulele to Hawaii. Whereas, the Hawaiian steel guitar was invented here in Hawaii by Joseph Kekuku, and the Hawaiian steel guitar should be the state instrument. I humbly ask you to select the Hawaiian steel guitar as the State instrument. It is the PONO thing to do.

My name is Kay Das and I am known to Alan Akaka for many years. As a steel guitar enthusiast, performer, promoter, and recording artist, who was inspired by Alan, I would like to add to this testimony towards changing the nomination of the ukulele as "state instrument" for Hawaii. The ukulele, although a fine instrument, has association with Hawaiian music due to it being easy to learn, great to carry around in a back-pack, that can be taken to the beach or fireside primarily to accompany singing. And it is true that its popularity has grown immensely in recent years for these very reasons. It is, however, a universal instrument and can be found on the beaches of Rio de Janiero, Brighton, Florida, and many beach resorts and clubs promoting its popularity. It has no unique association with the state, history, and musical culture of Hawaii.

The steel guitar, however, has a very unique association with the history, state, and culture of Hawaii. It was invented in Hawaii, and that seems to have been no accident. The sounds of the steel bar moving across strings lent itself to the embryonic nature of music composed in Hawaii and traditional to it. And that is why the steel guitar merits a unique place in the music of Hawaii. There is no other instrument that brings the aura of Hawaii back to the visitor when he or she has returned home. A small personal anecdote: I was playing the steel guitar impromptu with ukulele friends on the pier at Waikiki one evening last May. A lady from England walked up to me and said that she had been in Hawaii a couple of weeks but the enduring memory of her visit was going to be the sound of the steel guitar on that pier that evening.

I think I have said it all right there.

On a larger perspective, the steel guitar as an art form in Hawaii needs as much encouragement as it can get. It is a difficult instrument to master and therefore not readily taken up by the youth of today. Alan is doing sterling work in bringing the steel guitar to the young and needs all the support possible. What better way to make this happen than making it the state instrument of Hawaii?

I am so happy to hear that a musical instrument is to be given the honor of being the "Instrument of Hawai'i", but I hope you will give serious thought to your choice.

I spent 6 years researching the history of a young lad, Joseph Kekuku, born in La'ie, O'ahu in 1874. At that time Hawaiians were making music with the guitar brought in by the paniolos, except they "slacked the keys". It was the slacked-key guitar that 8 year old Joseph Kekuku continued to puzzle his parents with, by sliding metal objects up and down the strings. They thought he'd give that up when he became old enough to hold a guitar and play it in the proper way. But he never did. When he enrolled at the Kamehameha School for Boys the teachers recognized the beauty in what Joseph was doing, so they

assisted him by removing the gut strings and replacing them with piano wire. From then on it was.....great and greater.

Joseph performed for his fellow students and taught them how to play the new instrument too, and gave assistance to his father who had the assignment to provide fresh fish for

any visitors that might arrive from the royal palace. And when he turned 30 years old,

Joseph joined with two other musicians and began his musical tour of the U.S. mainland and the countries of Europe, "playing before the crowned heads of Europe" is the way it

was reported. He married a lady from England but they produced no children. They

came back to the U.S. in their late years, where he set up a school teaching how to play the steel guitar, died in 1904, and is buried in the graveyard of the Town of Dover, NJ.

With all the above information, I wrote the book The Hawaiian Steel Guitar And Its Great Hawaiian Musicians which can be seen for sale on the website

My name is Warren Barnes. I am writing to oppose SB 3107 as drafted.

The ukulele is an honorable instrument, but is not uniquely identified with Hawaii. Even when it is used as background in Hawaiian music, more often than not it is along with a Hawaiian Steel Guitar. I am unaware of any data that would suggest that naming the ukulele Hawaii's official musical string instrument would spread Hawaiian culture or have a favorable impact on Hawaii's economy.

By contrast, the Hawaiian Steel Guitar is uniquely identified with Hawaii. In fact, it is indigenous to Hawaii. Moreover, throughout the world the unique sound of the Hawaiian Steel Guitar, as solo or background, causes listeners to think immediately of Hawaii and frequently fuels a desire to be in Hawaii. That association exists with no other instrument. I believe that naming the Hawaiian Steel Guitar Hawaii's official musical string instrument would do more to spread Hawaiian culture and enhance Hawaii's economy than any other no-cost measure.

I have played four other instruments, but I love my Hawaiian Steel Guitar the most. On any Island and anywhere on the mainland, with my Hawaiian Steel Guitar I participate in and, ideally, help to spread Hawaiian culture. More than anything else in the world, the Hawaiian Steel Guitar is uniquely and delightfully Hawaiian, and that is precisely why I play it.

In summary, I urge a "no" vote on SB 3107. I also recommend that you favorably consider naming the Hawaiian Steel Guitar the official musical string instrument of Hawaii.

Dear and Honorable Hawaii Legislators:

Currently HB2573 and SB 3107 are put forward to have the Ukulele confirmed as the State Stringed Instrument of Hawaii.

I oppose this vehemently. The ukulele is NOT of Hawaiian origin any more than a bagpipe is.

The ukulele is of Portuguese origin. While it is true that it is widely popular within Hawaii, and recognized world-wide as being a worthy instrument for playing Hawaiian melodies on, IT IS NOT OF HAWAIIAN ORIGIN.

Historically what we now called ukulele is more correctly called the Braguina as it was named in its native Portugal. (also called the machete do braga). It is a fine instrument, fun to play, portable, not too expensive, etc...but none of these traits makes any less of what it truly is and that is an instrument of Portuguese design and origin. It is an adopted instrument, not an instrument of Hawaii.

To make the ukulele the state stringed instrument would be as blasphemous as making the Zebra dove the state bird. The Zebra dove can be seen everywhere, it is the bird most tourists could identify as one they saw in Hawaii, but it is not *from* Hawaii; it is not a Hawaiian bird; it was introduced to Hawaii just as the ukulele was.

For Hawaii to adopt an instrument representative of Hawaii, the state of Hawaii, and the people and heritage of Hawaii we should appoint a musical instrument conceived and created here in Hawaii. The only instrument that embodies ALL of these qualities and aspects is the Hawaiian Guitar, or as it is more popularly known now, the Lap Steel, or Hawaiian Lap steel guitar.

Historically the Hawaiian Lap steel creation is attributed to Hawaiian schoolboy Joseph Kekuku in 1885. That date Precedes the introduction of the Portuguese instrument that has become known as the Ukulele, and right there is the defining difference between choosing the Hawaiian Guitar as the state stringed instrument as opposed to the ukulele. <u>The Hawaiian Guitar (lap steel guitar) was invented right here in Hawaii. The ukulele was brought to Hawaii and introduced here.</u>

The Hawaiian guitar was so popular on the mainland in early-to-mid-1900's that it spawned a giant Hawaiian music fad and eventually that Hawaiian sound began to be incorporated into other genres of music. This is how Hawaiian music changed the world. That sound found its way into swing, blues, country, show tunes, Big band era music and eventually nearly every other form of music, and that sound was INVENTED right here in Hawaii. The instrument that creates that sound was INVENTED right here in Hawaii.

If the intent is to exemplify the creativity, the music, the heritage, the spirit and the tradition of the Hawaiian people it should be represented by an instrument OF the Hawaiian people. And that instrument is the Hawaiian Lap Steel Guitar.

My name is Buck Giles, born and raised on the island of Oahu. I am a professional musician and employee of the City and County of Honolulu Ocean Safety Division. I'm a supporting member of the Hawaiian Steel Guitar Association (HSGA) and an advocate for the preservation and EDUCATION of all Hawaiian musical traditions. Being a multi-instrumentalist I perform regularly and have recorded on numerous albums with the Hawaiian steel guitar being my primary instrument.

Not to be confused with Slack Key guitar which is common among local residents and visitors, the indigenous Hawaiian Steel Guitar is the signature sound of Hawaii and Hawaiian music hands down. There is no other instrument in the world that when hearing the lilting sound and glissando of the steel bar on the strings that screams Hawaii. Despite its popularity world wide the Hawaiian Steel Guitar has become a fragile musical tradition almost forgotten and not very well documented as one of the most important instruments to influence Hawaiian, American and world guitar ethos. Its impact in the first half of the 1900's helped to shape Hawaiian and American music as we know it today and created the first world music craze of the 20th century. The style and method invented by Hawaii's own Joseph Kekuku became so popular that the first electric guitar was a Hawaiian Lap Steel. It then became the signature sound of country music and influenced the guitar style of the blues.

When it comes to traditions in Hawaii we all know that it is very important to do your homework. To choose any instrument by popularity to represent Hawaii without thoroughly investigating its history would not be just.

Aloha Chairs, Vice Chairs and Honorable Members of the Committees. I am submitting testimony in <u>STRONG</u> support of SB 3107 and HB 2573 which would designate the 'ukulele the official string instrument of Hawai'i.

My husband and I grew up on Moloka'i – he at Kualapu'u school and I at Maunaloa and Kaunakakai Schools - where we all learned to play the 'ukulele. Only two instruments were played by ALL students – flutophones and 'ukulele. At May Day and Christmas programs, at least one class would perform with 'ukulele. We did not appreciate it as much back then, but as our children were growing up and playing 'ukulele in school, we realized how great a part the 'ukulele has played in every Hawai'i child's life. If a child in Hawai'i didn't learn to play it, their friends played, their family gatherings had at least one 'ukulele being played, or they heard it on the radio, TV, and movies. My husband coached baseball and volleyball on Molokai, and when we traveled for games, at least one of the players would bring their 'ukulele along. Other teams who travelled to Moloka'i would do the same.

About five years ago, both my husband and I started working at Kamaka Hawaii, Inc. As he strung the ukuleles, he would tell the younger workers, "You know what it means to be holding this ukulele and helping to build it? This is a legacy right here." He no longer works here, but I still do, and I've seen the growth of this little instrument worldwide. When someone talks about the resurgence of the 'ukulele, they mention Israel Kamakawiwo'ole and Jake Shimabukuro – both from Hawai'i. When you see posters and advertisements for Hawai'i, you see the 'ukulele. And the majority of our customers, whether from Hawaii, the continental U.S., Canada, Japan, Australia, Thailand, Taiwan, Malaysia, Europe...all attribute the 'ukulele to Hawai'i. No matter where the instrument is made, 'ukulele says "Hawaii". Some customers come in and say they have local stores selling ukuleles, but they wanted to be able to say their 'ukulele came from Hawai'i. We receive 3-5 'ukuleles for repair every day because parents and grandparents are passing their instruments on to their children and grandchildren, or they are now wanting to play their 'ukuleles again.

It really doesn't matter that the 'ukulele was derived from a Portuguese instrument. When you ask anyone anywhere in the world, "name an instrument played in Hawai'i." I'm sure the answer will be "'ukulele." There are several states who have claimed the guitar as their state instrument. Why not officially claim the 'ukulele as Hawai'i's state instrument? It is already recognized as such worldwide, anyway. Let's make it official.

It is for these reasons that I stand in <u>STRONG</u> support of SB 3107 and HB 2573. Thank you very much for this opportunity to submit my testimony.

My name is Fred Kamaka Jr., and I am here today with my father, Fred Kamaka Sr. on behalf of my family to support Senate Bill 3107 and House Bill 2573 which would designate the ukulele as the official string instrument of Hawaii. My grandfather, Samuel Kamaka Sr. began making ukuleles in 1916, and my family will soon be celebrating our 100th anniversary of Hawaiian ukulele making. My family continues to make our instruments using many of the same techniques of my grandfather, and we are known for our traditional Hawaiian ukulele sound and design.

Today, we are only one of many manufacturers of ukulele worldwide. We handcraft our instruments in Hawaii at our Kakaako factory on South Street, where we have been located since 1959. Although today we cannot keep up with the worldwide demand for the instrument, it was not always that way. As my uncle and father can tell you, in the 1960's and 70's, the popularity of the ukulele waned. It was thought that the ukulele was on its way out, and that it was simply an instrument from Hawaii that was just another passing fad.

But the ukulele, this humble four-stringed instrument, was not a quitter. Even during this downtime, Hawaii public schools continued to teach children how to play the ukulele, local people and Hawaiian musicians kept on strumming. Even people like George Harrison of the Beatles, bucked the downward trend, and in famous footage from the 70's, busted out his 4-string Kamaka concert ukulele to jam with fellow band member Paul McCartney.

And so began the glorious come back, the huge resurgence of interest in the ukulele beginning in the 80's, increasing in the 90's and surpassing all expectations to the present day, not only locally, but nationally, and internationally. The ukulele can now be found everywhere. For example, although many people know that we have made ukulele for musicians such as the late Genoa Keawe, Israel Kamakawiwoole and Jake Shimabukuro, we have also made ukulele for Ziggy Marley, Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson, Eddie Vedder, Bill Cosby and Adam Sandler. Even Matthew Morrison played a Kamaka tenor during the first season of Glee, singing Israel Kamakawiwoole's "Somewhere Over the Rainbow." Having a ukulele is like carrying a piece of Hawaii with you wherever you go.

Whenever people ask us, "what is the best ukulele for me?" we always tell them, the ukulele that makes you happy when you play it. Because it's not about a brand, or a maker, so much as it is about the joyful and resilient spirit of this humble instrument that is directly reflective of the hearts of the people of our state. The simple, laid back, happy, no worries, underdog of an instrument... that is our ukulele.

The world sees it as Hawaii's string instrument, and I am here on behalf of my ohana to say let's make it official. Mahalo for the opportunity to provide testimony today, and as my uncle tells everyone he meets, keep strumming.
