Chairs Chun Oakland and Espero, Vice Chairs Green and Baker, and Members of the Committees:

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) **supports the intent** of Senate Bill 312, which would allow the Hawaii Public Housing Authority to pursue arrangements or enter into agreements with the Department to provide aid and cooperation for the security of the residents, staff, buildings, and lands of the Authority. Senate Bill 312 would also allow the Hawaii Public Housing Authority to reimburse the Department for all costs incurred by the Department for employment of additional personnel, procurement of goods, equipment, furniture, and supplies utilized by the Department to provide the requested services.

Presently, the Department does not have the infrastructure or personnel to provide the additional services requested by the Hawaii Public Housing Authority;

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however, the proposed amendments to Section 356D-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes would give the Hawaii Public Housing Authority the ability to reimburse the cost of additional Deputy Sheriff positions and required equipment to provide the services requested by Senate Bill 312.

In consideration of Senate Bill No. 312 Relating to the Department of Public Safety Sheriff Division Entering into Agreements to Provide Security at Public Housing Projects Operated by the Public Housing Authority

Honorable Chairs and Members of the Senate Committees on Human Services and Economic Development, Government Operations and Housing, thank you for the opportunity to provide you with comments regarding Senate Bill (S.B.) No. 312, relating to the Department of Public Safety Sheriff Division entering into agreements to provide security at public housing projects operated by the public housing authority.

The Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA) <u>supports</u> the intent of this measure, which would allow the HPHA to enter into agreements with the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to provide security at our low-income resident communities. However, after discussing this measure with the DPS, we were informed that due to their limited amount of personnel, it would not be feasible for the DPS to facilitate a request for security. Therefore, the HPHA will defer to the druthers of the Chairs.

The HPHA appreciates the opportunity to provide the Senate Committees on Human Services, and Public Safety, Intergovernmental and Military Affairs with the agency's position regarding S.B. No. 312. We respectfully request the Committee to pass this measure favorably, and we thank you very much for your dedicated support.
