BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 279E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§279E-3 Metropolitan Planning Organization membership.

4 (a) The MPO shall consist of a policy committee and appropriate

5 staff. The MPO policy committee shall consist of [thirteen]

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1 (b) Each member of the MPO policy committee who is a member of the state legislature or the legislative body of the 2 county shall serve for the same term as the term of office for 3 4 which the member is elected. There shall be no remuneration for 5 this service. (c) Vacancies in the MPO policy committee that occur shall 6 7 be filled in the same manner in which the original member was 8 appointed." 9 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 11

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) supports Senate Bill 479 SD2, as amended.

The voters of the City and County of Honolulu approved a City Charter amendment in November 2010, establishing HART, a semi-autonomous agency of the City and County of Honolulu responsible for the planning, design, construction, and maintenance of Honolulu's fixed guideway rapid transit system.

On July 6, 2012, President Obama signed into law P.L. 112-141, the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21). One of the new provisions of MAP-21 is the following:

"Not later than 2 years after the date of enactment of MAP-21, each metropolitan planning organization that serves an area designated as a transportation management area shall consist of...officials of public agencies that administer or operate major modes of transportation in the metropolitan area, including representation by providers of public transportation."¹

The addition of HART to the Oahu Metropolitan Planning Organization's policy committee ensures compliance with MAP-21 and would be consistent with HART's duty to plan, administer, and coordinate programs and projects of the fixed guideway system.
