- pass the rood safety certification exam, and
- 10 (G) <u>The producer must keep honey production volume, and honey product distribution</u>
- 11 records for a period of not less than two years, and must be made available to the
- 12 department.

- (E) The statement, "This product is home-produced and processed." in clear and conspicuous print."
- (E) The statement, "This product is 100% Hawaiian produced and processed." in clear and conspicuous print."

HFUU reminds the honorable legislators that our premium products are more valuable in the open market than their imported counterparts, and that is because people expect that when they purchase products grown in Hawaii, that is what they are getting, not some percentage thereof. People also want assurance they are supporting local farmers, not people in China, or the mainland.

Sadly, the truth in labeling bills: HB 213 and SB 558 died in committee this session, but we encourage you to ask your colleagues to move those bills forward in the next session as brand Hawaii's reputation is at stake here, and food fraud is not what out products need to become known for.

We respectfully ask you to amend SB 482 to prevent the adulteration of our pure Hawaiian produced honey supply.
