TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL NO. 506, S.D. 2, H.D. 1, RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING.

My name is Celia Suzuki, Licensing Administrator for the Professional and

Vocational Licensing Division, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs

("Department"). The Department appreciates the opportunity to submit comments on

Senate Bill No. 506, S.D. 2, H.D. 1, Relating to Professional and Vocational Licensing.

The purpose of Senate Bill No. 506, S.D. 2, H.D. 1, is to amend Act 248, Session

Laws of Hawaii 2012, to clarify the requirements for service member licensure in

Hawaii. While the Department supports the intent of the bill, it does have concerns with

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the language on Page 5, lines 1 -3, and on Page 6, lines 17 – 19, which exempts medical doctors, dentists, or certified public accountants from the requirements of Act 248. We do not understand the rationale for this exemption, as it tends to defeat the purpose of the Act, which is to require the licensing authority to consider an applicant's military education, training, or service.
