### VALLEY ISLE OUTLOOK FOR 2013 Work in Maul Looks Promising for the Year

#### [MAUI, HAWAII] -- Happy New Year!

Wishing you a Happy and prosperous New Year as we start off 2013.

The employment status on Maui looks very promising as 98% of our members are working. We did see 100% employment at the end of 2012 due to the **Windfarm Project** on the slopes of Haleakala. The project has been completed, most of the members went back to work for another Company, and a few will be referred out shortly.

The Solar Telescope atop Haleakala has begun with Du-Watts Electric. The weather is cold and the air is thin at the Project location above the 10,000 foot elevation. The project should last for three years with a completion date at the end of 2016. Other projects for Du-Watts include the Costco renovations, Fire Alarm work at the Four Seasons and the Grand Wailea Hotels. Security System work at the Maui Airport, the Residences at Milo Court, the West Maui Federal Credit Union, the Pilholo Water Treatment Plant, Control Wining at the Kinei Wastewater Lift Stations, and other smaller projects.

Work at a new Guest Room Tower will begin at the Hyatt Regency Hotei in Kaanapali. A new parking lot is currently being built, and renovation of an existing parking lot will be completed before the Tower gets started. All of this work at the Hyatt Regency is being done by Wasa Electrical Services, Inc., who has the most of our members employed. Other Projects for Wasa include the Andaz Renovation in Walea, Puu Kukui Elementary School, the Safeway at Maui Lani, the Maui Lani Shopping Center, the Kamole Water Treatment Plant, and an EV Charging Station at the University of Hawaii-Maui Campus. Projects on Lanai include the expansion of Lanai High and Elementary School, the Lanai Community Hospital, and renovations at the Four Seasons Hotel at Manele Bay.

Lite Electric has been steady with work and looking forward to new projects as well. Some of their projects include the Residences of Hooiea Terrace at Kehaiani and the Traditions at Maui Lani, Water Pump Stations with the County of Maui, Wastewater Sewage Treatment Plant Renovations, the Dialysis Wing at the Maui Memoriai Medicai Center, and even projects on Molokai, the Kaunakaki Ferry Terminal and the Telecommunications Upgrade for the State Office Building.

Other Maui Signatory Contractors include **Teshima Electric**, which has a few members employed in various smaller projects around the island. **Dorvin Lels Company**, a mechanical contractor who has an electrical department that handles the control wiring for the company, has a couple of our *mem*bers as well.

Our Telecom Contractors who employ Local 1186 members include Oceanic Time Warner Cable, Henkeis & McCoy, Integrated Broadband Network Solutions (IBNS), and Home Security and Sound dba Hawaii Low Voltage.

As you notice by the projects mentioned, work is at a steady pace with more to come in 2013. We are looking forward to another great year.

The rodeo events consisted of Pole Climbing, 46kV Grounding/B phase, Cutout Door Re-Fuse, Primary & Neutral Tie In, 8' Cross Arm Replacement, and Pole Rescue.

There were over 2,000 people that attended and watched these events. A lot of the people had never heard or even seen this type of rodeo. Most of them watched with amazement at what a lineman's job entailed. After these events were finished, all of the people walked away with much more of an understanding, respect, and appreciation for our Union Linemen.

### FROM THE DISPATCH OFFICE:

All Journeymen Wiremen in Books 1, 2, and 3, MUST bring the following current items before signing the book.

- 1. State of Hawaii EJ License
- 2. CPR card
- 3. Blood Borne Pathogens
- 4. First Ald
- 5. OSHA 10 (minimum)
- 6. Current Dues Receipt

All Journeymen Wiremen should obtain the above mentioned items for advanced placement in the books. For more details, please contact your Union Office at (808) 847-5341 for the Examining Board Standards. MEMBERS SEEKING EMPLOYMENT:

For those who are not currently employed, it is your kuleana (responsibility) to keep yourself available for employment.

Responsibility of Applicant. It shall be the responsibility of the applicant to sign the appropriate registration book in person. Re-signing of the book may be done in writing, e-mail, fax, or by telephone at the end of each calendar month to signify that he/she is available for employment. It shall be the sole responsibility of the applicant to insure that the Union has received notification of re-registration. If no contact has been made with the Union, the applicant's name will be stricken from the registration book and the applicant will be deemed unavailable for work.
