Chair Espero and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General has determined that the Auditor does not have the legal authority to completely fulfill the requirements of this bill.

This bill directs the Auditor to conduct a financial and management audit of the commissary operations of the Department of Public Safety and "out-of-state contracted correctional facilities where Hawaii inmates are confined[.]" Section 23-4(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), authorizes the Auditor to conduct post-audits of the transactions, accounts, programs, and performance of all departments, offices, and agencies of the State. The term "departments, offices, and agencies" is defined to include

all executive departments, boards, commissions, bureaus, offices, agencies, and all independent commissions and other establishments of the state government (excepting the legislature) and all quasi-public institutions and all courts which are supported in whole or in part by, or which handle state or public funds[.]

HRS § 23-1.

The "out-of-state contracted correctional facilities where Hawaii inmates are confined" are privately owned and operated and therefore not quasi-public institutions. The Auditor thus does not have the authority to audit the commissary operations of these facilities.

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We respectfully ask the Committee to amend the bill by deleting the following provisions from section 2

", as well as the operations of the commissaries in out-of-state contracted correctional facilities where Hawaii inmates are confined;".
