TESTIMONY BY KALBERT K. YOUNG DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND FINANCE STATE OF HAWAII TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE ON SENATE BILL NO. 591

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

Senate Bill No. 591 authorizes the director of finance to issue general obligation bonds to fund capital improvements for the former Galbraith estate property.

The Department has technical comments on this bill. Federal tax law requires, among other things, that tax-exempt general obligation bond proceeds be used to finance projects that serve public purposes. As it appears that private entities may derive the benefit from this legislation, tax-exempt general obligation bond proceeds cannot be used for this purpose. The State would need to issue taxable general obligation bonds at a higher cost in order to allow the agribusiness development corporation to provide financing assistance to private entities.

In addition, as public funding for these projects are not in the proposed Executive Budget, the annual debt service of approximately \$670,000 should also be proposed in the Legislature's budget.

SENATE BILL NO. 591 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Chairperson Nishihara and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill No. 591. This measure allows the director of finance to issue general obligation bonds in the sum of \$8,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for c apital improvements to the former Galbraith estate property. The Agribusiness Development Corporation (ADC) supports this bill.

The State, Office of Hawaiian Affairs, City and County of Honolulu, the Army and a private donor through the Trust for Public Lands recently purchased land from the Galbraith estate. We would like to amend the bill to state that the total acreage for Galbraith lands be 1,723 instead of 1,200. ADC's primary mission is to transition these unimproved plantation lands into diversified farms. This bill will provide the corporation with the required capital to make the necessary improvements and develop a surface irrigation system. At this present time, the Galbraith land does not have an irrigation system compatible with today's diversified agricultural farming operations.

ADC respectfully requests that the Committee pass this bill. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.
