Comments: I am a certified child passenger safety technician instructor, and coordinator of the child passenger safety program on Oahu. I often have technicians ask me about the liability risk involved when they are helping parents to install their child safety seats. It is a concern for many of them. It is also a deterrent to becoming certified by others who initially express interest in this community service. This measure will help us recruit and train more technicians, and will provide an increased level of confidence for those who choose to help parents in this way. Motor vehicle crashes are a leading cause of death in young children, and most deaths and injuries are due to improper restraint. Anything we can do to increase the number of children who are properly restrained will prevent some of these deaths and injuries. This measure will do just that by helping to increase the number of certified technicians available to educate parents. I ask you to pass this bill.
