Chair Rhoads, Vice-Chair Har and members of the House Committee on Judiciary, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu submits the following testimony in support of S.B. 635, S.D. 1, H.D. 1.

The purpose of S.B. 635, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, is to add "law enforcement animals" to the existing offenses of "Causing injury or death or a service dog," and "Intentional interference with the use of a service dog." The Department strongly agrees that law enforcement animals are an integral part of Hawaii's law enforcement and corrections agencies, hand-selected and highly trained for their jobs. These animals diligently work side-by-side with law enforcement officers, deputies and other personnel, and should be afforded special protections. The Department believes that language presented in S.B. 635, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, will work alongside existing animal cruelty statutes, to deter this specific type of offense and better protect the interests of both service dogs and law enforcement animals.

Dear Honorable Chair Rhoads, Vice-Chair Har and Committee Members,

We support enhanced penalties for the intentional harm or abuse of a law enforcement animal, and believe they deserve the same protections as service animals and pet animals. Many states have already enacted similar laws to protect these animals who put their lives on the line in their course of duty to protect humans and public safety.

We respectfully request that **Page 4**, **line 4 and Page 6**, **line 4**, **exempting cropping and docking as** <u>customarily practiced and permitted by law be stricken</u>. Neither law enforcement nor service animals should be subjected to these painful procedures unless performed by a licensed veterinarian using proper anesthetic and pre and post-operative care.
