TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL (SB) 635, SENATE DRAFT (SD) 1, HOUSE DRAFT (HD) 2 RELATING TO ANIMAL CRUELTY By Ted Sakai, Director Department of Public Safety

Chair Luke, Vice Chairs Nishimoto and Johanson, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Public Safety (PSD) **supports** SB 635, SD1, HD2 which amends the language to create the offense of cruelty to a law enforcement animal in the first degree, making it a felony to intentionally or knowingly cause the death of or substantial bodily injury to a law enforcement animal while the animal is engaged in its law enforcement or corrections duties. This bill also adds new language to create the offense of cruelty to a law enforcement animal in the second degree, making it a misdemeanor to intentionally or knowingly cause injury to or to recklessly cause the death or substantial bodily injury of a law enforcement animal while the animal is engaged in its law enforcement or corrections duties. PSD views its drug and bomb detection dogs as part of our Law Enforcement family and feels that SB 635, SD1, HD2 would help deter an individual from injuring our dogs while conducting searches, if the suspect knew that there were criminal penalties for such an action.
