Chair Ige, Vice Chair Kidani, and Members of the Ways and Means Committee:

I am Major General Darryll D. M. Wong, State Adjutant General. I am testifying in FAVOR of Senate Bill 680.

SB 680 will strengthen Homeland Security in Hawaii by codifying functions we are already performing and consolidating them in one office that reports to the Homeland Security Advisor to the Governor (one of the important hats I wear as the Adjutant General).

SB 680 establishes the Office of Homeland Security in the State Department of Defense. The state Office of Homeland Security will take over and strengthen a number of programs that State Civil Defense has been running since 2001, including grant management, critical infrastructure protection and processing security clearances for local and state government. The Hawaii State Fusion Center will now come under the Office of Homeland Security.

SB 680 provides a legislative basis for performing tasks and missions that we are already doing. This bill will allow us to organize more efficiently and move personnel from State Civil Defense into this new structure to provide better support to the people of Hawaii. Establishing the Office of Homeland Security requires no additional funding – personnel and office space already exist within SCD and DOD.

I strongly urge you to pass SB 680 as written.
