Aloha Chairs Nishihara and Espero, Vice Chairs Kouchi and Baker, and members of the Committee:

My name is Alicia Maluafiti, Executive Director of the Hawaii Crop Improvement Association, a nonprofit trade association representing Hawaii seed farmers. We are in strong support of SB 681 to establish a temporary food security task force and ask you to consider an amendment to include a representative of the Hawaii Crop Improvement Association.

As the largest agricultural commodity in the state, the seed farmers' participation on the task force would be invaluable because they have expertise in various agronomic areas (above and beyond biotechnology) that would be important to developing the plan and helping to address most objectives listed in section (f) of the bill including:

- Addressing lands to be cultivated in an emergency: Collectively, the seed farmers own or lease 25,000 acres of agricultural land of which only approximately 8,000 acres are in production at any point in time.
- Identify irrigation equipment and infrastructure needs: Seed farmers have invested heavily in repairing and maintaining irrigation systems on their lands.
- Identify the best crops to grow: Seed farmers grow both traditional hybrid as well as genetically engineered crops, and many produce non-GE fruit and vegetable seeds that are being grown by farmers worldwide.
- Identify current agriculture operations or companies to assist in growing crops: Seed farmers employ 25 percent of the entire agricultural workforce in the state.

Finally, as multi-national companies, they have an extensive international network of information and resources that could contribute to development of the plan.

HCIA appreciates your consideration and applauds your effort to address this important need. In an emergency, we share your concerns about how we are going to feed our families. Mahalo.
