My name is Margaret Wille, Chair of the Hawai'i County Council Committee on Agriculture, Water and Energy Sustainability testifying in <u>STRONG OPPOSITION</u> to SB727 Relating to Economic Development. I am submitting this additional testimony to supplement testimony submitted previously.

Upon close scrutiny, it is clear that SB727 is a direct attack on the authority of the Counties to govern local matters that concern matters affecting the health and well-being of County residents. SB727 effectively guts HRS 46-1.5 "General powers and limitation of the counties" by narrowing the County's authority to matters affecting private property and the general security of the County, to wit, SB727 in pertinent part provides:

Each county shall have the power to enact ordinances deemed

necessary to [protect health, life, and property, and to preserve]:

- (A) Protect property; or
- (B) <u>Preserve</u> the order and security of the county and its inhabitants...

This bill is an outrageous affront to home rule. It is the County's foremost obligation to address matters of the general health and well-being of its residents. If this disgraceful legislation is passed, only matters specifically delegated by the state legislature will be within the jurisdiction of the Counties, except with respect to matters specific to protecting private property and security issues.

I repeat from my previous testimony: In Hawai'i, the counties are the level of government closest to the People. Please do not attempt again to consolidate political power in the capital centers of Honolulu and Washington, D.C., which are awash in special interest money and whose revolving door regulatory agencies are stacked with former industry lobbyists. Please take heed of the ramifications of attempting to remove the authority of the local government to respond to the public on the street.

## **TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION TO SB 727**

Aloha Chair Rhoads and Members of the Committee:

The Sierra Club of Hawai'i, with over 10,000 members and supporters, respectfully *opposes* SB 727. This measure is somewhat indecipherable, but appears to be an attempt to restrict county ordinances that protect property.

This measure removes the words "health" and "life" from the power of a county to enact ordinances that protect " Governments usually have the police power to protect "health, safety, morals, and general welfare" of residents. The elimination of a few key phrases casts into doubt the power of counties to enact some types of ordinances. It is possible this measure could have drastic unintended consequence of repealing a number of existing ordinances.

Moreover, we note that counties usually cannot override state or federal regulations under the supremacy clause. It is only where the state or federal government have delegated power, such as the power to zone, that the counties have any power at all. *See, e.g., Wash. v. Wash. State Commercial Passenger Fishing Vessel*, 443 U.S. 658, 695 (1979) ("State-law prohibition against compliance with the District Courts decree cannot survive the command of the Supremacy Clause of the United States Constitution"). It is unclear why this measure is necessary.

#### **Position: Support with Amendments**

Aloha Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Har, and members of the Committee:

My name is Alicia Maluafiti, Executive Director of the Hawaii Crop Improvement Association, a nonprofit trade association representing Hawaii seed farmers. We support SB 727 which clarifies the kuleana of county government - with the following amendment:

In section **S46-1.5 (13)**, HCIA proposes that the bill retain the original language found in the statute related to the protection of health, life and property, but retain the new federal language.

Sadly – some lawmakers have misused their elected positions to push politically popular legislation with constituents in order to further their higher office ambitions. These ordinances are not only fiscally irresponsible to the unknowing tax payer but they put the county at risk of further litigation by being unable to effectively implement and enforce laws that are not the kuleana of county government. More often, these laws promote a culture of NIMBY-ism (Not In My Back Yard) by pitting counties against counties.

For the business community, these practices are troublesome because they create a patchwork quilt of laws for companies with statewide operations. In effect, they interfere with economic development opportunities by adding unnecessary levels of bureaucracy that should be governed by state or even federal authorities that have the resources and expertise to better regulate certain activities.

Some examples of bills and ordinances in which the counties overstepped their kuleana include:

- 1. A Hawaii island ban on biotechnology in which Mayor Kim cited the "difficulty, if not impossibility," of enforcing the ban. Agricultural biotechnology is regulated by the state and federal government.
- A Maui island ordinance restricting commercial aquarium fishing which was passed by the county council after failed attempts at the state level. The activity is currently regulated by the state and federal government and subsequently shut down the aquarium fisherman businesses.
- 3. A Hawaii island dairy farmer growing genetically engineered corn to feed his cows is harassed by activists who announce their intention to ban the growing of GMO corn on the island. There are only two remaining dairies in

Hawaii and this dairy farmer faces catastrophic economic losses if the county is successful in passing and ordinance at the whim of constituents.

- 4. Hawaii's seed farmers who face an onslaught of threats by GMO activists who have fear and intimidation to push their personal agendas. The industry is the most regulated commodity in the nation but some county lawmakers see opportunity in riding a political wave of opposition to shut down the industry and put 2,000 employees on the state's unemployment roll.
- 5. A group called Kauai Rising which not only targets the seed farmers, but who has proposed ordinances that directly call for the pre-emption of federal and state laws. This extreme group is comprised of the same vocal minority that shut down the Super Ferry.
- 6. A Hawaii island lawmaker who believed that vaccines caused autism and who pushed to ban vaccinations on the island.

What might be popular opinion is not always the pono position. Lawmakers must take the high road and often are forced to make the unpopular policy decision – sometimes putting their own re-election at risk. But counties have a wealth of responsibilities already: roads, sewers, trash, water, police, fire, emergency services, parks and recreation. They do not have Departments of Education, Health, Agriculture, Land and Natural Resources.

This bill simply reminds lawmakers at all levels of government of their kuleana to introduce and pass appropriate laws that are uniform and can be addressed by their respective governing bodies. And it gives peace of mind to businesses, including the agricultural community, that common sense will prevail over hysteria, fear mongering and intimidation.

Dear Committee Members:

I am writing to oppose the passing of SB727.

In this draft proposal of the bill you have stated:

(12) "Each county shall have the power to enact and enforce ordinances necessary to prevent or summarily remove public nuisances and to compel the clearing or removal of any public nuisance, refuse, and uncultivated undergrowth from streets, sidewalks, public places, and unoccupied lots."

Yet you have stricken the portion of the bill stating "[protect health, life, and property, and to preserve]: "

(13) "Each county shall have the power to enact ordinances deemed necessary to [protect health, life, and property, and to preserve]:"

So it seems to me that while you are proposing that" each county shall have the power to enact and enforce ordinances necessary to prevent or summarily remove public nuisances" you are also proposing that Hawaii Counties may not pass laws that will protect the health, and life of it's residents. Therefore Hawaii Counties may prevent or remove public nuisances but not if they pose a danger to health, life or property.

In addition the bill proposes "Appoint county physicians and sanitary and other inspectors as necessary to carry into effect ordinances made under this paragraph, who shall have the same power as given by law to agents of the department of health, subject only to limitations placed on them by the terms and conditions of their appointments;" yet again these appointees may prevent or remove public nuisances but not if they pose a danger to health, life or property.

The bill further states:

"on any subject or matter not inconsistent with, or tending to defeat, the intent of any state<u>or federal</u> statute, <u>rule</u>, <u>or regulation that</u> does not disclose an express or implied intent that the statute, <u>rule</u>, <u>or regulation</u> shall be exclusive or uniform throughout the State;"

Perhaps this section would prove to be sensible within states on the mainland but here in Hawaii, counties are on separate islands separated by expanses of ocean. Due to this, it is my opinion that each county needs to be able to set regulations that will protect the health, and life of its residents based upon local conditions. Conditions are usually different on each island and county of Hawaii and the need for regulations to come from the State legislature or a regulation that is exclusive or uniform throughout the state

would be a hindrance and would cause delay in action that would negate the intent of this bill and could actually cause harm to the health, and life.

#### **Report Title:**

County Ordinances on Property, Order, and Security; Conflicts with State and Federal Laws

#### **Description:**

Expressly prohibits the enactment of county ordinances relating to the protection of property and the order and security of inhabitants, if the ordinances conflict with the intent of state or federal statutes, rules, or regulations.

Aloha Chair and Committee Members,

This is one convoluted piece of legislation. I hesitate to even call it legislation.

#### Please. Hold this bill.

It has no clarity, is poorly written and does not define its purpose and intent; is it for Emergency Response, Economic Development or is it something else? We do not tolerate Delphic laws.

It would appear that some in this legislature believe they can fragment the Constitution and take some parts and leave the rest. By doing this, sections of the Constitution are taken out of context and the spirit and intent, to say the least, is eliminated. You cannot fragment the Constitution. If one section says you can do one thing but another section demonstrates an impact because of your action, then your proposed legislative action is wrong. If it is contradictory to the constitution, which **SB727** clearly is, then it is repugnant to the constitution and thereby NULL and VOID.

Hawaii State Legislature Testimony Opposing SB727

#### Dear Legislators:

I have been a resident of Hawaii most of my life. In this time I have had the distinct pleasure of living on three of the eight islands. This experience has taught me one thing. Each island is entirely different. The differences extend beyond the landscape; the people themselves are different, and their needs are different. I believe this is the reason we divide the state into counties and delegate the power of self-determination to the counties. It is important that we do not lose sight of this during this debate.

Laws serve a primary purpose of protecting those without power from exploitation. The people of each county are charged with the task of deciding what is in the best interest of their people, and because each island is so different, this answer will change depending on where you ask the question. For example the people of Oahu face daily problems with traffic congestion that the people of Maui do not. The people of Hawaii Island deal with smothering vog, which only occasionally affects the neighboring islands. Therefore these people should have the choice to allocate resources and combat these issues in a manner, which is proportional to the problem. They should not have to appeal to the state to have these issues addressed. It is their sovereign right to address these challenges to their health and welfare.

For this reason I oppose SB727. The counties of Hawaii and more specifically the people of Hawaii do not benefit from the removal of the delegated authority to protect our own health and welfare and make decisions that determine our future. When legislation such as this comes along one must ask the essential question; who benefits? In this case the answer is obvious. The primary benefactor is large agribusiness corporations who in the face of mounting pressure are turning to legislative means to deny the people of Hawaii their rights to decide which agricultural practices are consistent with the individual health, sustainability, and cultural goals of their individual islands.

Please do not deny the people the right to make these decisions. Corporations are not obliged to protect the health and welfare of the people; that is the task of our elected representatives. Too many times our elected representatives put the protection of corporate profits above the protection of the health and welfare of the citizens. I urge you to vote against SB727. Do not remove this simple right to self-determination. It is not in the best interest of the people of Hawaii.

Honorable Chairman and Committee,

Mahalo for the opportunity to testify Respectfully Oppose SB727 which would strike out the counties ability to "protect, health, life, and property and to preserve".

There seems to be an idea circulating that we should somehow preempt home rule and just go with the intent of federal, state statutes, rules and regulations which may be much weaker than local regulation, rule making and community planning.

A 2009 <u>memo</u> from President Obama opposed preemption in all federal rule-making. The memo correctly notes: "Throughout our history, state and local governments have frequently protected health, safety, and the environment more aggressively than has the national government."

Any federal standard must set a floor and not a ceiling, and not hand preemption over to industry. The role of the federal government is to set minimum standards, while still allowing states to go further."

I live a few months out of the year in Waikiki and the rest of my time in my home in Phoenix, AZ. I have two children, I own and run a small commercial and residential real estate Brokerage and my husband is an executive for a large multi-national company. Because of my serious health issues I attribute to GMOs I have become an advocate for education on this important issue and have been for years.

Monsanto has been forced to accept the opinion of the Advertising Code Committee in the Netherlands over a misleading advertisement on their agrochemical Roundup. The company did not appeal against the decision of the committee of 11 December 2012. The ad titled "Roundup, the facts" appeared in June 2012 in the Telegraph and The Vokskrant. This advertising is misleading in the propositions that the herbicide "would have no effect on the soil", "would not remain in the soil" and "would not penetrate the soil," the Advertising Code Committee said.

The complaint was filed against by campaign website <u>toxicsoy.org</u> together with Corporate Europe Observatory and Pesticide Action Network. The complaint was substantiated with references to scientific studies from different countries.

Tjerk Dalhuisen, one of the authors, says, "The ad was trying to give the impression that Roundup is harmless. It contained gross factual inaccuracies. Roundup is harmful to the soil and is a major problem for the drinking water supply. Roundup causes considerable damage to humans, animals and nature."

# GE Scientists in India Found Guilty of Fraud and Cover Up

A group of scientists from the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) and the University of Agricultural Sciences (UAS) have been found guilty of infecting and subsequently hiding the fact that indigenously created Bt cotton contained a

Monsanto gene. The variety, called BNBt, was supposed to be a cheaper alternative to the other Indian Bt cotton hybrids. Shortly after its release in 2009, its sales were suspended, and then hearings commenced. It's now been determined that the Indian scientists intentionally contaminated the GE cotton seed, because "accidental contamination cannot explain what happened." ICAR condemned the scientists' actions as "unethical, unscientific, and irresponsible." It appears these shenanigans occurred in order to somehow speed up the seed's release into India's Bt cotton marketplace.

The hearing's outcome falls on the heels of a major decision in October 2012 by a committee, appointed by India's Supreme Court, to end all GE field trials until certain conditions have been met. The Committee also recommended a 10-year moratorium on field trials of all Bt food crops and a moratorium on field trials of herbicide-tolerant crops until an independent assessment has performed. Perhaps India has finally had enough. Over the past 16 years, more than a quarter of a million Indian farmers have committed suicide after being convinced to plant Monsanto's genetically engineered seeds (especially Bt cotton), then having their crops fail, leaving them in financial ruin. Could this be a harbinger of times to come in the United States?

# Latest Study Shows Roundup Creates Botulism Breeding Ground in Poultry

A new German study by the Institute of Bacteriology and Mycology examined the effects of glyphosate, the active agent in Monsanto's herbicide Roundup, on the gut microbes of poultry. Some birds are heavily exposed to glyphosate when fed genetically engineered feed. The study's findings are quite alarming. Researchers found that highly pathogenic bacteria resisted glyphosate, whereas beneficial bacteria likely succumbed to it.

What does this mean for you and me? The essential implication is that poultry fed GE corn or soy would fall victim to dysbiosis, meaning unhealthy changes in their gut flora that threaten the health of the birds, as well as anyone consuming them. The good bacteria in the poultry gut, such as Enterococcus, Bifidobacterium and Lactobacillus, are killed off, allowing the pathogenic or disease causing bacteria to flourish. Varieties such as Salmonella and Clostridium are very dangerous pathogens for humans. Clostridia bacteria are some of the deadliest, with strains including C. tetani (tetanus) and C. botulinum (botulism). Chickens bred in CAFOs are already routinely fed antibiotics, arsenic, and even antidepressants, all of which have serious adverse health consequences. But this new study suggests CAFO chickens exposed to glyphosate may become breeding grounds for Botulism, Salmonella and other major pathogenic organisms. The implications of this become even clearer when you consider the recently released findings of a decade-long feeding study that showed GE feed can cause significant changes in the digestive systems, immune systems, and major organs (including liver, kidneys, pancreas, genitals and others) of rats, mice, pigs and salmon. If it's doing all of that to animals and fish, what's it doing to you? Clearly, the conventional agribusiness food system has emerged as a major

threat to your health. But it may also be contributing to an even greater problem: the destruction of the world's topsoil.

# Horizontal Gene Transfer Is Now Proven By Science

The following complications underscore the seriousness of the dangers introduced by cultivation of GE crops:

• DNA from GE plants is not readily broken down in the soil and can be taken up by soil particles and microbes. The accumulation of foreign DNA may lead to a cumulative loss of soil diversity over repeated harvests.

• Unlike the claims of Monsanto when it first approved GM crops, Bt genes (*Bacillus thuringiensis*) are not broken down, for the reasons already stated, so can accumulate in soil and potentially produce Bt toxins. These toxins may build up in the soil, further damaging the organisms crucial for soil fertility. Research from the New York University confirms that Bt toxins are not broken down by soil microbes and do indeed accumulate in soil; the toxins maintain their ability to kill insects, potentially creating superbugs that further endanger the ecosystem.

• GE DNA is able to merge with the DNA of other organisms to create new varieties of soil microorganisms that disrupt the ecological balance. These new organisms, if virulent enough, could spread widely via wind erosion and ground water to compromise soil fertility on a broader scale.

• A Swiss study showed that adult earthworms feeding on transgenic Bt corn lost 18 percent of their initial weight, suggesting GE DNA may have long-term toxic effects on earthworms. Earthworms are major decomposers of dead and organic matter in the soil and are major contributors to the recycling of nutrients. An earlier study showed that both earthworms and collembolans (another small soil-dwelling invertebrate) can be adversely affected by Bt crops.

• Its also been shown that glyphosate can be toxic to rhizobia, a nitrogen-fixing bacterium. Nitrogen fixing bacteria are important because nitrogen is the nutrient most commonly deficient in soil.

GE crops are adversely affecting our soil biology in numerous ways. There are differences observed in the bacteria occupying plant roots and changes in nutrient availability. Many studies show glyphosate can have toxic effects on microorganisms and can stimulate them to germinate spores and colonize root systems. Glyphosate has also been shown to immobilize manganese, an essential plant nutrient. Overall, glyphosate diminishes the health and nutritional value of the plants it's sprayed on, as well as the soil.

The two main types of GE foods—herbicide-tolerant crops and pesticide-producing crops—are both imprecise technologies riddled with unintended consequences,

including *hundreds to thousands* of genetic mutations that have unknown effects on human health. Glyphosate and GE crops may be leading the human race over a cliff, as Dr. Don Huber explains in the following interview.
