I support the provision in this bill to provide for the compensation of an animal rescue organization that receives animals pursuant to a lawful seizure based on various animal cruelty provisions. This will ensure that the costs expended by the rescue organization will not be absorbed by by it which would limit the ability to address the needs of other animals.

I have a couple questions about the bill:

- Why are the provisions of the bill limited to "any duly incorporated humane society or society for the prevention of cruelty to animals"?
- What kinds of rescue organizations would fit these descriptions?

I note that a number of the sections in the bill are due to be repealed and reenacted on July 1, 2015, based on Act 149 of 2011. Assuming this provision is to be permanent, some minor changes might need to be made to the bill
