#### THE TRUST FOR PUBLIC LAND'S TESTIMONY IN PARTIAL SUPPORT OF SB 894 RELATING TO LAND ACQUISITION

Senate Committees on Water & Land Tuesday, February 5, 2013, 1:50 p.m., Room 225

The Trust for Public Land supports those portions of SB 894 relating to voluntary collaborations, and opposes other portions relating to involuntary condemnation. The Trust for Public Land supports employing collaborative and voluntary land conservation tools to protect the undeveloped lands surrounding the Turtle Bay Resort. However, as a voluntary land conservation organization, The Trust for Public Land cannot support the use the State's condemnation power to force a landowner to sell property involuntarily.

The Trust for Public Land and the North Shore Community Land Trust are currently working with the owners of the Turtle Bay Resort to place an agricultural conservation easement over 464 acres of agricultural land located mauka of the resort (where the fruit stand is located), using State Legacy Land Conservation Program, County Clean Water & Natural Lands Program, and Army Buffer Program funding. The land will be restricted to agricultural uses in perpetuity and taken out of the development equation.

Collaborative solutions using voluntary land conservation tools such as conservation easements, or out-right fee purchases may be possible if sufficient funding is available to achieve these goals. We support the Legislature's efforts in taking initial steps to set aside funds to conserve the important undeveloped lands at Kawela Bay and Kahuku Point -- some of the last undeveloped coastline along the famed North Shore.

Although The Trust for Public Land strongly supports those portions of the bill relating to voluntary collaborations, I cannot attend the hearing due to scheduling conflict. My sincere apologies.

The Honorable Malama Solomon Chair and Members of the Committee:

My name is Buddy Ako, and **I strongly oppose SB 894, Relating to Land Acquisition.** My family has lived in Koolauloa Area for the last 60 years. I am also employed by Turtle Bay Resort (and its predecessors) since 1979. I have personally been involved in the early movements by the Hawaiian community to preserve and protect our Hawaiian rights and resources.

I also sit on the Kahuku Burial Committee and we have accepted the kuleana to malama the iwi kupuna from this land. I have personally participated in meetings to discuss iwi kupuna and have personally appreciated the sensitivity of this developer to ensure that iwi kupuna are respectfully cared for and protected.

After the sugar plantation closed it was the Kahuku community who asked the developer at that time to build a master planned resort community and an initial hotel to provide jobs, housing, and economic opportunities not only for our generation but for the generations to come. Many of the employees, like me, live in the Koolauloa Area. The TBR proposal ensures good jobs, affordable work force housing for our employees, and community members, as well as it proposes a project that respects and honors the traditional native Hawaiian land stewardship values. In addition, the new Proposed Action Master Plan responsibly balances environmental, community and ownership interests. This bill was originally introduced by then Governor Linda Lingle during a time when there was opposition by the community against the previous developer for amongst other things failing to engage the community, relying upon a 20 year old environmental impact statement (EIS), disrespecting native Hawaiian burials, and proposing over 3,500 hotel and resort units. Since 2008, the new developer, Turtle Bay Resort (TBR), has spent the last 2 1/2 years meeting with over 250 groups and individuals, prepared a supplemental EIS (SEIS), voluntarily convened at least two public open houses on the SEIS, voluntarily prepared a supplemental archaeological inventory survey, and substantially reduced the density of the proposed development by 60%, increased affordable work force housing by 171%, shoreline access, shoreline setbacks and more.

Not only does a majority of people in Kahuku support the TBR project, but in a recent poll conducted by the Star Advertiser (56%) and in an independently conducted poll (62%) of the community support the revised TBR expansion plan. The proposed improvements at TBR include the preservation forever of over 460 acres in agricultural use in partnership with the Trust for Public Lands and the North Shore Community Land Trust, which represents an opportunity for our community to be sustainable and means that total 1,321 acres of Turtle Bay lands that over 75% will remain in open space. Keeping the land solely in preservation as SB 894 proposes DOES NOT provide construction and hotel jobs, employment opportunities for this generation and generations to come, affordable workforce housing, additional recreational shoreline access for Oahu residents or better management of the cultural and natural resources of the area. More importantly this bill is contrary to previous commitments made by the State, City & County and Developer to our community and the majority of the community who supports this project.

For these reasons, I respectfully and strongly oppose SB 894.

Chair Solomon, Vice Chair Shimabukuro, and members of the committee:

My name is Junior Primacio, vice president of the Kuilima North Shore Strategy Planning Committee (KNSSPC), a longtime former member of the Koolauloa Neighborhood Board, and last but not least, a lifelong Kahuku resident. I have been a part of more than 15 community organizations in the area, and I am a product of the Kahuku Sugar Plantation.

I **oppose** Senate Bill 894, which directors the governor, or governor's designee, to continue to acquire lands for Turtle Bay Hotel and Resort in Kahuku, Oahu.

As you know, Turtle Bay Resort was created to provide jobs for the community after the mill closed. The KNSSPC was formed in 1983 to identify ways in which Turtle Bay Resort's redevelopment could benefit regional residents. The 1986 Unilateral Agreement three decades ago was a hard-won plan with Turtle Bay Resort to guarantee more jobs in the future.

The committee, which was composed of approximately 130 resident members from the North Shore Ko'olauloa regions, successfully negotiated numerous entitlements which include but are not limited to, Affordable Housing, Beach Access Right of Way, Child Care, Public Park Access, Employment and Career Training for job opportunities in the future.

I support Turtle Bay Resort's current plans for expansion. But I will be honest with you: I am disappointed in their plans to reduce density by over 60 percent, from five hotels down to two. That means fewer jobs for our families. According to University of Hawaii statistics, the per capita income in the Kahuku area is almost 25 percent lower than the state average. Unemployment is high, as is the percentage of people receiving food stamps and Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF).

At Kahuku High School alone, more than 200 of our children graduate. We need local jobs to keep our children in the community. We live too far from town, and for decades, Turtle Bay Resort has remained as one of the few large employers in our region. The community suffers as the brain drain grows larger.

Turtle Bay Resort has performed its best efforts to work with and obtain input from the community, including the KNSSPC. Their reduced plans reflect an honest effort to work with us, despite my preference for a full build-out of their original plans. This is why I support Turtle Bay Resort's development, and why I oppose SB894.

The fate of the North Shore lies in the hands of a few elected and appointed officials. I am writing this letter to call upon all elected officials, lawmakers, and appointees who have any influence on the current process involving the potentially disastrous proposal threatening one of Oahu's most pristine coastal treasures in the area surrounding Turtle Bay Resort. The resort's owners are seeking approval for a massive and sprawling development which is a 325% increase of the resort's current rental rooms and residences. The footprint of this development gobbles up the acres and acres of raw land on either side of the Turtle Bay Resort, including the charming and one-of-a kind Kawela Bay. The developer's renderings do not accurately convey the scope and magnitude of the project. Aerial photos of the area can provide a much more comprehensive view of the massive amount of land which would be engulfed by the proposed development. This resort sprawl must not and should not be allowed to move forward.

As a voter and a taxpayer, I request that all parties involved in the decision making process base their decisions on <u>the reality of today's infrastructure</u>. Our infrastructure on the North Shore isn't just limited, it is crippled. It is becoming increasingly dysfunctional at an alarmingly rapid and consistent pace. Residents and visitors alike get stuck in lengthy, bumper-to-bumper traffic almost daily on the North Shore. This happens not only on the days of big waves, surf contests, weekends, and holidays, but even on uneventful weekdays; a drive of a few miles from Haleiwa to Foodland can result in a random 45 minute traffic delay.

One of the most consistent sources of traffic comes from the tour buses which stop at Laniakea and create a stop-and-go situation throughout the day, everyday of the week. In addition to this unceasing traffic jam, the buses also cause a dangerous situation for visitors who stream across the road, sometimes quite heedlessly. The abrupt traffic slowdown has also caused accidents. I know someone personally who was rear-ended and still suffers severely from back and neck pain. To my knowledge, no flashing lights have been installed to warn people of the abrupt halt to traffic flow.

Even if the above described "Turtle Traffic" were addressed by either disallowing the tour buses to do business on the side of the road, and/ or constructing a new road around this area, the reality is, with the current number of cars on the road from residents and visitors, any further increase in the number of automobiles is utterly untenable. Kamehameha Highway already looks like a parking lot much of the time. It will not function with any added stress.

Honolulu is currently ranked as the worst city in the entire nation for time spent in

traffic. The "Country" has always been a beloved refuge for Oahu residents and visitors. It is served by a two-lane highway. It is the beauty and tranquility that draw residents and visitors to the North Shore. But if the current developments go forward, developments which include the following: Kamehameha School's plan for hundreds and hundreds of homes in Haleiwa as well as new shopping centers; Andy Anderson's "Haleiwa Hotel;" Turtle Bay Resort's 325% increase in occupancy and resort sprawl; Laie's Marriot Hotel; and also the many hundreds of homes which are either proposed for the Laie area or have already been approved for the Laie area. If these developments go forward, there will be no more North Shore. Again, *the reality is*, if all of these developments go forward there will be no North Shore as we know it. We will have failed to preserve one of the most pristine coastlines for future generations. And we will have created a traffic situation worse than Honolulu, which is already the worst traffic in the nation. Our two lane highway will become a parking lot. Hotels will have gobbled up a large swath of raw coastal area. What will be left of our island when all of our roads look like parking lots and hotels cling to our coastline like barnacles?

The Honorable Malama Solomon Chair and Members of the Committee:

My name is Ralph Makaiau, and **I strongly oppose SB 894, Relating to Land Acquisition.** Born and raised in Kahuku, 5 generations of my family still lives in Kahuku. I am also employed by Turtle Bay Resort (and its predecessors) since April 1972.

Before the sugar plantation closed, it was the Kahuku community who asked the operator of the plantation to seek out a developer for job opportunities. Alternative agriculture was not viable at that time. Further research gave promise for community to invite a developer to build a master planned resort community and an initial hotel to provide jobs, housing, and economic opportunities not only for our generation but for the generations to come. Many of the employees, like me, live in Kahuku and want our children to be able to live and work in our own community. The TBR proposal ensures good jobs, affordable work force housing for our employees, and community members, as well as it proposes a project that respects and honors the traditional native Hawaiian land stewardship values. In addition, the new Proposed Action Master Plan responsibly balances environmental, community and ownership interests because it has ongoing solicitation for community input by the present ownership. This partnership bill was originally introduced by the Legislature during a time when there was opposition by a minority of the community against the previous developer for, amongst other things, failing to engage the community, relying upon a 20 year old environmental impact statement (EIS), disrespecting native Hawaiian culture, and proposing over 3,500 hotel and resort units. Since 2008, the new developer, Turtle Bay Resort (TBR), has spent the last 3 years meeting with over 250 groups and individuals, prepared a supplemental EIS (SEIS), voluntarily convened at least two public open houses on the SEIS, voluntarily prepared a supplemental archaeological inventory survey, and substantially reduced the density of the proposed development by 60%, increased affordable work force housing by 171%, shoreline access, shoreline setbacks and more.

Not only does a majority of people in Kahuku support the TBR project, but in a recent poll conducted by the Star Advertiser (56%) and in an independently conducted poll (62%) of the community indicated support or that developer had made enough positive changes in the revised TBR expansion plan. The proposed improvements at TBR include the preservation forever of over 469 acres in agricultural use in partnership with the Trust for Public Lands and the North Shore Community Land Trust, which represents an opportunity for our community to be sustainable and means that total 1,321 acres of Turtle Bay lands that over 75% will remain in open space. Keeping the land solely in preservation as SB 894 proposes DOES NOT provide construction and hotel jobs, employment opportunities for this generation and generations to come, affordable workforce housing, additional recreational shoreline access for Oahu residents or better management of the cultural and natural resources of the area. In addition, I believe this is an improper use of the State's power of eminent domain. More importantly this bill is contrary to previous commitments made by the State, City & County and Developer to our community and the majority of the community who supports this project.

For these reasons, I respectfully and strongly oppose SB 894.

Chair Solomon, Vice Chair Shimabukuro, and members of the committee:

My name is Sarah Cadiz, I serve as a local banker in Kahuku, Secretary of the Kuilima North Shore Strategy Planning Committee and have also been involved in many boards in the area, including the Kahuku Medical Center, Koolauloa Community Health and Wellness Center, Kahuku.org as well as serving as a lector at Sts. Peter and Paul Mission Church. Through my work and community service I've had the privilege of working with a number of residents and clients in Kahuku and the North Shore . They're my neighbors, and I've come to understand the realities they face.

As a longtime resident of the North Shore, I **oppose** Senate Bill 894, which directs the governor, or governor's designee, to continue to acquire lands for Turtle Bay Hotel and Resort in Kahuku, Oahu.

My main concern is the North Shore community's quality of life. There is dire need for funding elsewhere in the Koolauloa region. Our schools need money. Our early education programs need funding.

Senators, I ask this of you: What money is there in the General Fund for an acquisition as large as this? Will lawmakers continue approving raiding of our special funds? Who's going to foot the bill for interest on general obligation bonds that may be authorized by this Legislature? The money will come from us, the taxpayers, many of whom live in the North Shore, still deal with higher unemployment than the rest of Oahu, and live in multi-generational households due to financial necessity.

Not only is Turtle Bay just one of the few major employers in this region, but their proposed action includes plans for 160 new affordable homes, almost three times as much as it is required to build under the 1986 Unilateral Agreement. Turtle Bay Resort is working with KNSSPC to ensure that these homes will be truly affordable to members of our community.

We need affordable, livable conditions for our families. We need to put our people back to work. It's the only way we can get our local economy back on track. This is why I support Turtle Bay Resort's development, and this is why I oppose SB894.

### Aloha Senators,

I believe this to be an excellent investment of public funds and the timing is very good as well. Today interest rates remain historically low and the recent auction of developed resort parcels at Kapalua indicates the market for Hotel-Resort parcels remains depressed.

The City and County of Honolulu property tax assessed value is less than \$27 million for the parcels identified in the Turtle Bay Draft SEIS to be conserved. The Hotel owners in their DSEIS Conservation Partner Alternative state the value of their entitlements to be somewhere between \$10 and \$100 million. The land includes about 51 acres at Kawela Bay and 191 acres at Kahuku Point for a total of about 242 acres. This is based upon my analysis of the DSEIS and City Property tax data. The average assessed value per acre is \$111,600. The Owners and the City should be able to provide the State with precise values and acreage.

Unfortunately, we cannot turn back the clock and reverse the City and State land use decisions made in the late 70s and early 80s resulting in the rather poor decision to designate the Turtle Bay to be a resort destination area. Since then,

- The City and State have defined Ko Olina to be Oahu's outside Waikiki resort destination area.
- Surfing has become a major sport and the North Shore is the world's center of surfing.
- The Turtle Bay has rebranded itself as a surf resort rather than a golf resort.
- Residents and visitors in the thousands drive daily to the North Shore and the Koolauloa coast to enjoy their unique recreational and cultural resources.
- Drivers experience long traffic delays on Kamehameha Hwy. many of the days during the surf season (September to April) and during the summer.

The cost in public infrastructure and environmental/cultural oversight to the State associated with the City's approval of the proposed expansion is potentially enormous and offsets the cost to conserve the existing open space. \$50 million should be enough to avoid any expansion of the resort beyond its current footprint. The cost in interest will be relatively small compared to the cost to the State Agencies responsible for Kamehameha Hwy. and maintaining the environmental and cultural integrity of the Aina.

If we do not act now, our children and our children's children will ask "you could have set aside this land for \$50 million and you didn't do it?"
