SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONTRACTORS LICENSE BOARD TO CONDUCT AN ASSESSMENT AND PREPARE A REPORT THAT EVALUATES EACH LICENSING CLASSIFICATION UNDER CHAPTER 444, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's contractor licensing law, codified as 2 chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is a consumer protection 3 statute intended to protect the public's health, safety, and 4 welfare when dealing with persons engaged in the construction 5 industry, and therefore requires a licensee to show experience 6 for each license obtained; and

8 WHEREAS, the Contractors License Board is the governing 9 board for contractors licensed in Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, the Contractors License Board issues "A" general engineering contractor licenses, "B" general building contractor licenses, and "C" specialty licenses; and

WHEREAS, the Contractors License Board has adopted administrative rules that include various "C" specialty license classifications with categories and descriptions of each specialty license classification; and

WHEREAS, although payment of application, testing, and 20 license fees are required as part of the regulatory system for 21 contractors, the Contractors License Board automatically grants 22 seventeen additional "C" specialty licenses to licensed "A" 23 general engineering contractors and ten additional "C" specialty 24 licenses to licensed "B" general building contractors without 25 26 the need for further examination or additional payment of fees; 27 and

29 WHEREAS, past interpretations from the Contractors License 30 Board have determined that a "B" licensee may perform painting,



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ceramic tile, and other specialty licensed work required on a 1 project without possession of those specific licenses; and 2 3 WHEREAS, in addition, the C-5 Cabinet, Millwork, and 4 5 Carpentry Remodeling and Repairs specialty classification is automatically granted to "B" general building contractors; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the Contractors License Board has not recently 9 reviewed the criteria, requirements, and procedures for "A" 10 general engineering contractor licenses, "B" general building 11 contractor licenses, and "C" specialty licenses; and 12 13 WHEREAS, a comprehensive evaluation of each licensing 14 classification under chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 necessary to instill confidence in the construction industry and ensure that all criteria, requirements, and procedures for the 16 three licensing classifications are up to date; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, the 20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Contractors 21 License Board is requested to conduct an assessment and prepare 22 a report that evaluates each licensing classification under 23 24 chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Contractors License Board 26 27 is requested to include the following in the report: 28 29 (1)A comprehensive assessment and review of all licenses 30 issued pursuant to chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes, including the criteria, requirements, and 31 32 procedures needed for "A" general engineering contractor licenses, "B" general building contractor 33 licenses, and "C" specialty licenses, including all 34 "C" specialty licenses that are automatically granted; 35 36 (2) 37 An assessment of whether the state licensing 38 requirements are in line with similar licensing 39 requirements in other jurisdictions and meet general 40 construction industry standards and practices; 41 (3) A specific evaluation of the definition of a C-5 42 43 contractor, including whether this definition is too 44 broad, whether this definition includes an appropriate 2013-2103 SCR84 SD1 SMA.doc
