The State Council on Developmental Disabilities **SUPPORTS SCR 49 and SR 26**. The purpose of the concurrent resolution is to provide for the actions necessary to fulfill the legislative intent of SCR 145, Regular Session of 2011, and SCR 79, Regular Session of 2012, in order for the Board of Education and Department of Education to report their findings regarding the facilitation of family-school partnerships to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the Regular Session of 2014.

The Council supports the Board of Education and Department of Education working with parent organizations to establish policies and practices that encourage greater family engagement and can see the benefits that both families and schools would have with increasing student achievement through partnerships. Family engagement has worked with a variety of parent groups, and we see it as a critical component of student support that will increase both the schools' and families' abilities to support their children's education.
