TRAFFIC UPDATE - Farrington Highway

Week of Oct. 27, 2013

West Oahu/Farrington Highway Section (East Kapolei to Waipahu)

Farrington Highway in Ewa between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road Loop is closed in the west-bound direction as part of rail construction. The closure is needed to allow workers to safely relocate major utility lines located along the narrow two-lane highway.

- Drivers will still be able to travel west-bound between the Ewa/Waipahu region and East Kapolei by using either Kapolei Parkway or the H-1 Freeway.
- The public will also be able to access the Aloun Farms pumpkin patch during the last weekend of October via Farrington Highway through Kualakai Parkway.

Motorists will still be able to travel east-bound along that section of Farrington Highway, and will be detoured onto the Old Fort Weaver Road intersection near the Kahi Mohala Behavioral Center. Following the utility relocation work, the contractor is scheduled to re-close that section of Farrington Highway in both directions later this year for column construction as part of the planned rail guideway.

Shoulder and median work signage/cones along the side of the road will mark the work area. Motorists are advised to drive with caution and provide a safe distance between themselves, the construction workers and vehicles.

Daytime east- and west-bound lane closures will take place along Farrington Highway in Waipahu at the following locations from Monday, October 28 to Friday, November 1 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.:

• Between Kahualii Street and Waiawa Road for utility relocation work

Maintenance crews will also work along various sections of Farrington Highway in Waipahu. During the work, the contractor's vehicles may be temporarily parked in the highway lanes, causing a slight slowdown in traffic flow.

Nighttime east- and west-bound lane closures will take place along Farrington Highway in the Ewa and Waipahu areas at the following locations from Sunday, October 27 to

Thursday, October 31 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. for utility location and relocation work:

- Between Old Fort Weaver Road and Mokuola Street
- One lane in each direction of Farrington Highway in Waipahu will remain open at all times during the utility work

TRAFFIC UPDATE - Kamehameha Highway

Week of Oct. 27, 2013

Kamehameha Highway Section (Pearl City to Aloha Stadium)

Daytime lane closures will take place next week near Aloha Stadium at the following locations between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. for maintenance work:

- Inside lane of the H-1/Moanalua Freeway on-ramp along Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium on Monday, October 28
- West-bound right shoulder of Kamehameha Highway will be closed west of H-1 Moanalua Freeway on-ramp from Tuesday, October 29 to Friday, November 1

Nighttime closures will take place along Kamehameha Highway in Pearl City between Puu Poni Street and Kaahumanu Street from Sunday, October 27 to Thursday, October 31 between 10 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. for lane restriping:

- Crews will restripe the highway lanes and will alternate the lane closures throughout the week between the outside and inside lanes near the HECO-Waiau Power Plant and Waiau Center.
- One lane in each direction of Kamehameha Highway will remain open at all times during the work.
- Left turns onto and from Kuleana Street will be restricted during the night work. Drivers are asked to access Kaahumanu Street or Puu Poni Street as a detour.
- Please check TheBus's website at www.thebus.org on temporary bus stop relocations along Kamehameha Highway for the following stops: near the H-1 Freeway overpass, HECO-Waiau Power Plant, Kuleana Street, and Hila Place.

Shoulder and median work signage/cones along the side of the road will mark the work area. Motorists are advised to drive with caution and provide a safe distance between themselves, the construction workers and vehicles.
