# **District 27 Neighborhood Boards Agree: Support Likelike Elementary!**

During the month of September, District 27 Neighborhood Boards #12, #14, and #15 unanimously voted against the School Board's suggested closure of Likelike Elementary School, which would celebrate its 90th birthday next year.

As a community landmark with continually improving student test scores, particularly in math, closure of Likelike Elementary would be disruptive to its students' academic careers at their most critical stage.

Furthermore, redistributing Likelike Elementary's nearly 400 students would cause overcrowding in the surrounding schools such as Lanakila Elementary and others which are currently operating at ideal capacity.

Representative Ching gives her full support to keeping Likelike Elementary School open and is in the process of contacting School Board members to ensure the peoples' opinions are heard.
