1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

The Hawai'i Sacred Choir is a nondenominational, nonprofit choral music school incorporated in the State of Hawai'i on 10/14/2010. On 6/26/2012, we entered into a formal relationship with the Pacific American Foundation, an approved IRS 501(c)(3) organization, to function as our fiscal sponsor.

We are not a religious organization but sing sacred music of many kinds and from various faith traditions—music that touches the human heart in a special way. Sacred music is our niche.

Since 2010 we have had a total enrollment of approximately 80 state children (ages 7-13) and 120 adults for very high-level music and choral education. Most of these individuals had no prior formal music or choral training. Education includes correct musical tone production, intonation, dynamics, music literacy, and choral pronunciation in Latin, English and Hawaiian. We focus on performance practice and the intricate teamwork required to sing together beautifully as a large group.

We have demonstrated our progress for approximately 3,500 people and at the "Roll Call of Honor in Remembrance" Memorial Day ceremony at Punchbowl National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific in May 2011 (invited by the Pacific American Foundation).

As Hawai'i's only choir of children and adults singing together, we teach exemplary singing at the highest standards. Members of our choir participate in the *Voice for Life* program of the Royal School of Church Music an international organization which provides training and adjudicated award medals for achievement in vocal skills, musical understanding and knowledge of repertoire.

In time we intend to create a full academic institution in Hawai'i modeled after King's College Choir at Cambridge University, England.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Our objective is to enable the Hawai'i Sacred Choir to be singing ambassadors of aloha by being the first choir ever from Hawai'i to travel to England to serve as a visiting "choir in residence" for one week at a major English Cathedral. The standards for serving as a choir in residence at a major English Cathedral are extremely high; choirs from around the world apply years in advance to compete for this honor. Based on an audition recording, the Hawai'i Sacred Choir was chosen by Ely Cathedral (7th longest in the world), scheduled to sing daily services for the week of July 5-15, 2014.

Ely Cathedral's Handbook for visiting choirs stipulates that their masses are to be sung in either English or Latin; no other language. However, choirmaster Rev. Werning spoke with Ely's Music Director, who in turn brought it up at a meeting at Ely, and they approved our singing a Mass in the Hawaiian language. The music was composed by St. Andrew's past Canon Emeritus John McCreary and arranged specially for the Hawai'i Sacred Choir by choirmaster Rev. Daniel Werning. This event will be ground-breaking for both Ely Cathedral and Hawai'i.

We will also sing an additional song in the Hawaiian language. We will utilize a Hawaiian language consultant to help us to perfect everything sung in Hawaiian.

This trip will be an educational opportunity for the children and adults in the choir to learn about the history and culture of England and to immerse themselves in the traditions of cathedral choirs, which are the foundation upon which our choir is based. It will be an intercultural opportunity—a chance to represent Hawai'i and demonstrate the spirit of aloha.

Thus, our main project goal is to prepare both musically and culturally 13 children and 24 adults from Hawai'i to sing seven daily services for Ely Cathedral and then to send them to England from July 5-15 to fulfill our commitment.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

- Demonstrate to Hawai'i that children can be full and equal partners alongside adults in a complex activity unlike most other team activities, with the children mastering the same highly complicated parts as do the adults. The highly specialized training we provide children and adults singing *together* is unique among choirs in Hawai'i.
- Create a greater love for choral music in general and for very high-standard singing skills in particular among Hawai'i's children and adults.
- Create pride in Hawai'i by being the first choir ever from here to be invited to an international cathedral for a full week of performances, thus representing the State of Hawai'i and demonstrating mastery of international standards for sacred choral music in Hawai'i.
- Recruit and educate children and adults from diverse Hawai'i backgrounds to attain the high-level choral techniques and protocol required by Ely Cathedral for choirs in residence. These singers' unique expertise will benefit Hawai'i throughout their lives and leave an enduring mark on its musical culture.

- Enhance academic achievement and personal development among the children in the choir through the rigorous musical education we provide. Research has shown that music education positively affects development of literacy and numeracy skills, as well as social and personal development. Examples of this research include the following:
 - Glenn Schellenberg (http://pss.sagepub.com/content/15/8/511.short) reports that children who receive music lessons (voice or keyboard) display larger improvements in all verbal and non-verbal subtests of the Wechsler Intelligence Scale than those receiving drama lessons or no art-related lessons.
 - Martin Gardiner, et al., (http://www.music-ineducation.org/articles/1-R.pdf)
 reports that children who received music training display a larger improvement
 on standardized tests of reading and arithmetic than children receiving the
 standard curriculum.

4. Describe the target population to be served;

All children and adults in the State of Hawai'i, as well as the whole population surrounding Cambridge, England.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

Although our rehearsals, recordings and venues are primarily in Honolulu, we will also create awareness and pride for our project throughout Hawai'i and also in the country of England. Future plans include singing for all islands of Hawai'i and internationally.

II. Service Summary and Outcomes

- > We have finalized the choir roster of 37 people, including director and organist.
- We have contributed \$16,650 of our funds for deposits (see Project Budget).
- We have signed a contract for food, lodging, ground transportation and tour leadership through Richardson and Gray Ltd., English choir tour specialists, and have submitted deposits of \$250 per person, with final payment due by June 1, 2014.
- We have signed a contract for round-trip air transportation from Honolulu to London on United Airlines through Travel Initiative Inc. and have submitted deposits of \$200 per person, with final payment due by June 5, 2014.

- We have an educational plan and schedule in place to teach all the music and protocol required by Ely Cathedral according to their *Handbook of Requirements*. We are confirmed on their calendar for July 7-13, 2014.
- We have provided detailed information and trip schedules for all choir members, including information on how to secure a US passport and will monitor progress.
- Publicity is under way through the media, churches and other outlets in order to build support and excitement for the choir's groundbreaking venture.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

All organizational-responsibility costs will be paid as per the schedule in Section II-1. The choir's education required to complete this project is approximately one-third complete, with the remaining two thirds of instruction to be completed over the next five months, with final instruction and rehearsal taking place on Saturday, June 28, 2014. The choir will leave Honolulu for London, England on the morning of Saturday, July 5, 2014, and return to Honolulu upon completing the project on July 15, 2014.

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate and improve their results;

After approximately 50 years of advanced training, graduate degrees and experience in music and choral techniques, Choirmaster Reverend Daniel Werning is preparing the children and adults of the choir to meet the high international standards Ely Cathedral requires for our residency. In order to accomplish this, the children undergo two rigorous 1-1/2 hour rehearsals per week and the adults one rigorous 2-hour rehearsal per week, plus monthly 3-hour whole-choir rehearsals.

We have recorded previous singing events by the choir that are used as teaching tools to demonstrate which techniques of singing as a choir should be improved, and so also monitor and verify improvement in overall ability since our establishment.

As the State of Hawai'i's only affiliate of the Royal School of Church Music, we teaching this international school's graded workbooks that establish specific musical and choral goals for members of the choir to reach. We set goals for members and periodically award colored ribbons reflective of each individual's achievement level.

Reverend Dan Werning is beginning his fifth year as Organist/Choirmaster at St. Mark's Episcopal Church (Anglo-Catholic) on Kapahulu Avenue and his fourth year

as Choirmaster of Hawai'i Sacred Choir. His versatility and education have allowed him to serve a number of churches and schools in Hawai'i and on the mainland as organist, choirmaster and/or music director.

He holds two master's degrees, MCM (Master of Church Music) and MAR (Master of Arts in Religion). Altogether, he has over 40 years of accumulated experience in educational and theological ministry as pastor, organist, pianist, choir director, handbell director, Orff Schulwerk instructor, classroom music teacher, and director of music at six 1,000+ member congregations.

In addition, he is the author of *A Selected Source Index for Hymn and Choral Tunes*, CPH 1984; has composed choral pieces recorded by the Concordia Theological Seminary Kantorei; and has built two harpsichords.

The Hawai'i Sacred Choir has successfully sung at 25 Hawai'i community events, services and concerts since fall 2010, including at St. Andrew's Cathedral, the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa, Ala Moana Center Stage, Punchbowl National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, Kahala Nui Retirement Home, and other schools and churches.

B. Facilities
