A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO REPORTING DEATHS TO STATE AGENCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some governmental
 agencies within the State that keep official lists of persons,
 in the ordinary course of the agency's activities, need to know
- 5 example, discontinue providing benefits. Although section 338-

when members on their lists have died so that they can, for

- 6 18(q), Hawaii Revised Statutes, allows the department of health
- 7 to verify information contained in vital statistics records by
- 8 employing a process that matches its vital statistics
- 9 information with information provided by agencies, that process
- 10 cannot be used by state agencies whose lists are confidential
- 11 under federal law.

- The legislature also finds that it is unlawful for the
- 13 department of health to disclose information contained in
- 14 confidential vital statistics records, except as authorized by
- 15 law. Allowing the department of health to report deaths to
- 16 state agencies that maintain official lists that are
- 17 confidential under federal law would assist state agencies to

1 maximize the accuracy of their official lists and avoid overpaying benefits and wasting public funds. 2 SECTION 2. Chapter 338, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 4 5 and to read as follows: 6 "§338- Deaths reported to state agencies. (a) 7 Notwithstanding section 338-18, the department of health, within six weeks after the end of each quarter or other agreed upon 8 9 period, shall deliver to a state agency a list of the names of 10 all persons whose deaths have been recorded by the department 11 during that period; provided that this section shall only apply 12 to a state agency that: 13 (1) Maintains official lists of persons in the ordinary 14 course of the agency's activities and is prohibited by 15 federal law from sharing information from the lists; 16 and 17 (2) Has requested the information from the department 18 pursuant to a written agreement. 19 The list shall set forth the full name of the decedent and the 20 dates of the decedent's birth and death, if known. The

1	agreement the rorm and rormat or providing the information to
2	the agency.
3	(b) In response to an agency's first request pursuant to
4	subsection (a), the department of health may provide a list of
5	the persons whose deaths were recorded by the department during
6	an agreed upon period in the past. The department may charge a
7	reasonable fee to cover its cost of providing the list. If a
8	state agency requires further information, the department may
9	provide a certified copy of the death certificate to that state
10	agency, subject to the fees required under section 338-14.5.
11	(c) Any state agency that obtains, pursuant to this
12	section, a list of the names of persons whose deaths have been
13	recorded by the department of health shall use the list only for
14	the purposes for which it was obtained and shall not further
15	disclose any information on the list.
16	(d) The department of health may develop and implement or
17	assist with the development and implementation of a systems
18	interface to electronically provide the information required
19	pursuant to subsection (a) to a state agency."

SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 2 and shall be repealed on July 1, 2016.
