### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Prior to the establishment of the National 1 Council of State Boards of Nursing's consensus model for 2 advanced practice registered nurse regulation, each state 3 independently determined the advanced practice registered nurse 4 legal scope of practice, recognized roles, certification 5 criteria, and certification examination. This created a 6 significant barrier for advanced practice registered nurses to 7 move from state to state and decreased access to patient care. 8 The legislature finds that the importance of advanced practice 9 registered nurses in caring for patients' current and future 10 health needs cannot be understated. Nationally, advanced 11 practice registered nurse education, accreditation, 12 certification, and licensure must align to ensure patient safety 13 14 and to expand access to patient care. Subsequent to the establishment of the consensus model, Hawaii adopted every criteria of the consensus model for

- 1 finds that Hawaii must replace references to advanced practice
- 2 registered nurse recognition with advanced practice registered
- 3 nurse licensure, the latter of which is nationally accepted.
- 4 The legislature further finds that this amendment will neither
- 5 change the requirements to obtain or maintain advanced practice
- 6 registered nurse status nor affect the advanced practice
- 7 registered nurse scope of practice.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to eliminate a barrier to
- 9 licensure in other state boards that question the equivalency of
- 10 Hawaii advanced practice registered nurse recognition to the
- 11 standard of advanced practice registered nurse licensure.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 457-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "§457-1 Purpose. In order to safeguard life and health,
- 15 any person practicing or offering to practice as an advanced
- 16 practice registered nurse, a registered nurse, or a licensed
- 17 practical nurse in this State for compensation shall be required
- 18 to submit evidence that the person is qualified to so practice,
- 19 and shall be [recognized or] licensed as provided in this
- 20 chapter. It shall be unlawful for any person not [recognized
- 21 or licensed under this chapter to practice or offer to practice
- 22 nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse, a registered



- 1 nurse, or a licensed practical nurse; or to use any sign, card,
- 2 or device, or in any manner indicate or imply that the person is
- 3 an advanced practice registered nurse, a registered nurse, or a
- 4 licensed practical nurse."
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 457-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending the definitions of "advanced practice
- 7 registered nurse" and "the practice of nursing as a registered
- 8 nurse" to read as follows:
- 9 ""Advanced practice registered nurse" means a registered
- 10 nurse who has met the qualifications for advanced practice
- 11 registered nurse licensure set forth in this chapter and through
- 12 rules of the board, which shall include educational
- 13 requirements.
- "The practice of nursing as a registered nurse" means the
- 15 performance of professional services commensurate with the
- 16 educational preparation and demonstrated competency of the
- 17 individual having specialized knowledge, judgment, and skill
- 18 based on the principles of the biological, physical, behavioral,
- 19 and sociological sciences and nursing theory, whereby the
- 20 individual shall be accountable and responsible to the consumer
- 21 for the quality of nursing care rendered. The foregoing may
- 22 include but shall not be limited to observation, assessment,



- 1 development, implementation, and evaluation of a plan of care,
- 2 health counseling, supervision and teaching of other personnel,
- 3 and teaching of individuals, families, and groups in any stage
- 4 of health or illness; administration, supervision, coordination,
- 5 delegation, and evaluation of nursing practice; provision of
- 6 health care to the patient in collaboration with other members
- 7 of the health care team as autonomous health care professionals
- 8 providing the nursing component of health care; or use of
- 9 reasonable judgment in carrying out prescribed medical orders of
- 10 a licensed dentist, physician, osteopathic physician, or
- 11 podiatrist licensed in accordance with chapter 448, 453, or
- 12 463E; orders of an advanced practice registered nurse
- 13 [recognized] licensed in accordance with this chapter; or the
- 14 orders of a physician assistant licensed pursuant to chapter
- 15 453, practicing with physician supervision as required by
- 16 chapter 453, and acting as the agent of the supervising
- 17 physician."
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 457-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "\$457-3 State board of nursing; appointment; term of
- 21 office. The board shall consist of nine members as follows:

1	(1) Six shall be registered nurses, one of whom shall be
2	[recognized] licensed as an advanced practice
3	registered nurse in this State;
4	(2) One shall be a licensed practical nurse; and
5	(3) Two shall be public members.
6	Both nursing education and direct providers of nursing services
7	shall be represented on the board. The term of office for
8	members of the board shall be three years. No member shall be
9	appointed to more than two consecutive terms or serve more than
10	six consecutive years. Six members of the board shall be
11	residents of the city and county of Honolulu and three shall be
12	residents of counties other than the city and county of
13	Honolulu."
14	SECTION 5. Section 457-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
16	"(c) Each advanced practice registered nurse member of the
17	board shall:
18	(1) Have current, unencumbered [recognition] licensure by
19	the board as an advanced practice registered nurse;
20	and
21	(2) Have at least five years of experience in the practice
22	of nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse



1		and at least three years of active nursing experience
2		as an advanced practice registered nurse immediately
3		preceding appointment or reappointment."
4	SECTI	ON 6. Section 457-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by	amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
6	"(a)	In addition to any other powers and duties authorized
7	by law, th	ne board may:
8	(1)	Adopt, amend, or repeal rules, pursuant to chapter 91,
9		not inconsistent with the law, as may be necessary to
10		enable it to carry into effect this chapter, including
11		the definition of the scope of practice of nursing and
12		the delegation of nursing tasks based upon
13		professional nursing standards, which include but are
14		not limited to the standards set forth by national
15		certifying bodies recognized by the board;
16	(2)	Prescribe standards for preparing persons for
17		licensure as practical [+]nurses[ <del>] or</del> ] registered
18		nurses, and [for recognition as] advanced practice
19		registered nurses under this chapter;
20	(3)	Conduct surveys of educational programs as it may deem
21		necessary and practical;

1	(4)	Approve educational programs that meet the
2		requirements of this chapter and the rules of the
3	•	board;
4	(5)	Deny or withdraw approval of educational programs for
5		failure to meet or maintain the standards prescribed
6		in this chapter;
7	(6)	License qualified applicants by examination or
8		endorsement, [recognize] including advanced practice
9		registered nurses, and renew, reinstate, and restore
10		licenses [and recognitions];
11	(7)	Conduct hearings upon request of a denied applicant or
12		upon charges calling for discipline of a licensee;
13	(8)	Exercise the power to issue subpoenas, compel the
14		attendance of witnesses, and administer oaths to
15		persons giving testimony at hearings;
16	(9)	Cause the prosecution of all persons violating this .
17		chapter and incur necessary expenses therefor;
18	(10)	Keep a record of all its proceedings;
19	(11)	Provide consultation, conduct conferences, forums,
20		studies, and research on nursing education and
21	,	practice;

1	(12)	Communicate with national organizations that promote
2		the improvement of the legal standards of practice of
3		nursing for the protection of public health, safety,
4		and welfare;
5	(13)	Authorize the administration of examinations to
6		eligible applicants for licensure as registered nurses
7		or licensed practical nurses, or other examinations
8		required by the board as designated in its rules;
9	(14)	Employ, contract, and cooperate, to the extent
10		allowable by law, with any board-approved organization
11		in the preparation and grading of an appropriate
12		nationally uniform examination; provided the board
13		shall retain sole discretion and responsibility for
14		determining the standard of successful completion of
15		such an examination. When such a national examination
16		is used, access to questions and answers shall be
17		restricted by the board; and
18	(15)	Develop and adopt rules as necessary relating to the
19		practice of nursing in telehealth."
20	SECT	ION 7. Section 457-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended t	o read as follows:

1	"§45	7-8.5 Advanced practice registered nurse;
2	qualifica	tions; [recognition;] licensure; endorsement; fees;
3	eligibili	ty. (a) The board shall grant [recognition as] an
4	advanced	practice registered nurse <u>license</u> to a nurse who has:
5	(1)	A current, unencumbered license as a registered nurse
6		in this State;
7	(2)	An unencumbered license as a registered nurse in all
8		other states in which the nurse has a current and
9		active license;
10	(3)	An unencumbered [recognition] license as an advanced
11		practice registered nurse or similar designation in
12		all other states in which the nurse has a current and
13		active [recognition] license as an advanced practice
14		registered nurse;
15	(4)	Completed an accredited graduate-level education
16	•	program preparing the nurse for one of the four
17		recognized advanced practice registered nurse roles;
18	(5)	A current, unencumbered certification of having passed
19		a national certification examination that measures
20		role and population-focused competencies and is
21		recognized by the board;

1	(6)	Maintained continued competencies through
2		recertification in role and population-focused
3		competencies through a national certification program
4		recognized by the board;
5	(7)	Acquired advanced clinical knowledge and skills
6		preparing the nurse to provide direct care to patients
7		through a significant educational and practical
8		concentration on the direct care of patients;
9	(8)	Demonstrated a greater breadth of knowledge, a greater
10		synthesis of data, greater complexity of skills and
11		interventions, and greater role autonomy than
12		demonstrated by a registered nurse;
13	(9)	Been educationally prepared to assume responsibility
14		and accountability for health promotion and
15		maintenance and to assess, diagnose, and manage
16		patient problems through the use and prescription of
<b> 17</b>		pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic interventions;
18	(10)	Acquired clinical experience of sufficient depth and
19	. *	breadth to reflect the intended license; and
20	(11)	Paid the appropriate fees.
21	(b)	Any person [recognized] licensed as an advanced
22	practice	registered nurse prior to October 1, 2009, whose

              Only a person who has a current, unencumbered

    [recognition] license from the board to practice as an advanced

    practice registered nurse shall use the title "Advanced Practice

    Registered Nurse" and the abbreviation "A.P.R.N.". No other

    person shall assume the title "nurse" or in any manner imply that
11
    the person is a nurse except as defined in section 457-2 or as
12
    provided in sections 457-7 and 457-8 or use the abbreviation
13
    "A.P.R.N." or any other words, letter, sign, or device to
14
    indicate that the person using the same is an advanced practice
15
    registered nurse. Nothing in this section shall preclude a

    registered nurse who is not [recognized] licensed by the board

    as an advanced practice registered nurse and who is currently

    certified by a national certifying body recognized by the board

    from using another title designated by certification."

         SECTION 8. Section 457-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
    amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
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The license of every person licensed[,-recognized,] 1 "(a) or granted prescriptive authority shall expire on June 30 of 2 3 every odd-numbered year and shall be renewed biennially, except 4 as provided in this section. Biennially in each odd-numbered 5 year, the board shall make available an application for renewal 6 of license before the deadline set forth by the board to every 7 person to whom a license was issued or renewed during the 8 biennium. The applicant shall complete the application and 9 submit it to the board with a renewal fee and all required 10 documents on or before the deadline set by the board. 11 applicant shall provide documents from proper agencies or 12 parties of any criminal conviction or any disciplinary action taken or pending in this State or any other state in the United 13 States or any territory or possession under the jurisdiction of 14 15 the United States within the two years prior to application for 16 renewal of license. Upon receipt of the application and fee, 17 the board shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue 18 to the applicant a certificate of renewal for the biennium 19 expiring two years hence on the deadline set by the board. 20 renewal shall render the holder thereof a legal practitioner of 21 nursing for the period stated on the renewal form."

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1	SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
2	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
3	SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
4	provided that the amendments made in section 3 of this Act to
5	the definition of "the practice of nursing as a registered
6	nurse" shall not be repealed when that definition is reenacted
7	on July 1, 2017, pursuant to section 5 of Act 255, Session Laws
8	of Hawaii 2012.
