A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENDANGERED SPECIES RECOVERY COMMITTEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 195D-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
3	"(a) There is established within the department for		
4	administrative purposes only, the endangered species recovery		
5	committee, which shall serve as a consultant to the board and		
6	the department on matters relating to endangered, threatened,		
7	proposed, and candidate species. The committee shall consist of		
8	two field biologists with expertise in conservation biology, the		
9	chairperson of the board or the chairperson's designee, the		
10	ecoregion director of the United States Fish and Wildlife		
11	Service or the director's designee, the director of the United		
12	States Geological Survey, Biological Resources Division or the		
13	director's designee, [and] the director of the University of		
14	Hawaii Environmental Center or the director's designee[+], and a		
15	person possessing a background in native Hawaiian traditional		
16	and customary practices, as evidenced by:		
17	(1) A college degree in a relevant field, such as Hawaijan		

(1) A college degree in a relevant field, such as Hawaiian studies, native Hawaiian law, native Hawaiian

1		traditional and customary practices, or related	
2		subject area;	
3	(2)	Work history that demonstrates an appropriate level of	
4		knowledge in native Hawaiian traditional and customary	
5		practices; or	
6	<u>(3)</u>	Substantial experience in native Hawaiian traditional	
7		and customary practices.	
8	Nongovernmental members shall be appointed by the governor		
9	pursuant to section 26-34. Nongovernmental members shall not		
10	serve for more than two consecutive terms. Nongovernmental		
11	members shall serve for four-year staggered terms, except that		
12	one of the members first appointed shall serve for two years.		
13	Governmental members from the federal agencies are		
14	requested but not required to serve on the committee. The		
15	ability of the committee to carry out its functions and purposes		
16	shall not be affected by the vacancy of any position allotted to		
17	a federal governmental member."		
18	SECT	TION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
20	SECT	TION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
