A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD ABUSE.

STATE OF HAWAII

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that due to a lack of
- 2 dedicated resources, only about two per cent of known child
- 3 internet crime offenders are being investigated. Alicia's Law
- 4 is an initiative that builds state capacity to combat crimes
- 5 against children by securing funding for internet crimes against
- 6 children task forces. Alicia's Law was named for Alicia
- 7 Kozakiewicz, who was abducted by an internet predator and
- sexually abused.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to combat internet crimes
- 10 against children by establishing an internet crimes against
- 11 children fee and a special fund to assist law enforcement to
- 12 investigate and prosecute internet crimes against children and
- 13 groups working directly to fight internet crimes against
- 14 children.
- 15 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 16 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 17 as follows:

3	§ -1 Short title. This chapter shall be known as and		
4	may be cited as "Alicia's Law".		
5	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the		
6	context otherwise requires:		
7	"Internet crimes against children" means promoting child		
દ	abuse in the first degree under section 707-750, promoting child		
9	abuse in the second degree under section 707-751, promoting		
10	child abuse in the third degree under section 707-752,		
11	electronic enticement of a child in the first degree under		
12	section 707-756, electronic enticement of a child in the second		
13	degree under section 707-757, indecent electronic display to a		
14	child under section 707-759, or promoting pornography for minors		
15	under section 712-1215.		
16	§ -3 Internet crimes against children fee. (a) The		
17	court shall order every defendant to pay an internet crimes		
18	against children fee of up to \$100 for each felony or		
19	misdemeanor conviction; provided that no fee shall be ordered		
20	when the court determines that the defendant is unable to pay		
21	the fee.

- 1 (b) When a defendant is also ordered to pay a fine, make
- 2 restitution, pay a crime victim compensation fee, or pay other
- 3 fees in addition to the internet crimes against children fee,
- 4 payments by the defendant shall be made in the order of priority
- 5 established under section 706-648.
- 6 (c) The defendant shall pay the internet crimes against
- 7 children fee to the clerk of the court. The fee shall be
- 8 deposited with the director of finance who shall transmit the
 - fee to the internet crimes against children special fund
- 10 pursuant to section -4.
- 11 § -4 Internet crimes against children special fund;
- 12 established. (a) There is established in the state treasury
- 13 the internet crimes against children special fund, into which
- 14 shall be deposited:
- 15 (1) All fees collected pursuant to section -3;
- 16 (2) Moneys appropriated by the legislature to the fund;
- 17 (3) Other grants and gifts made to the fund; and
- 18 (4) Any income and capital gains earned by the fund.
- 19 (b) Moneys in the internet crimes against children special
- 20 fund shall be expended by the department of the attorney general
- 21 for the following purposes:

1	(1)	To provide training and equipment for local law
2		enforcement agencies to use in investigating and
3		prosecuting internet crimes against children,
4		including funding to increase the forensic capacity of
5		digital evidence;
6	(2)	To enable law enforcement to investigate and prosecute
7		internet crimes against children; and
8	(3)	To assist groups working directly to combat internet
9		crimes against children.
10	(c)	All unexpended and unencumbered moneys remaining in
[]	the inter	net crimes against children special fund at the close
12	of each f	iscal year that are deemed, by the director of finance,
13	to be in	excess of the moneys necessary to carry out the purpose
14	of this s	ection over the following fiscal year shall lapse to
15	the credi	t of the state general fund."
16	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
17	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$62,500 or so much
18	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to be
19	deposited	into the internet crimes against children special fund
20	under sec	tion -4, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
21	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the internet
22	crimes ag	ainst children special fund the sum of \$62,500 or so

- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 2 purposes of providing training and equipment to local law
- 3 enforcement, providing law enforcement with funds to investigate
- 4 and prosecute internet crimes against children, and assisting
- 5 groups working directly to combat internet crimes against
- 6 children.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun, before the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
