ACT 176 H.B. NO. S.D. 1

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MILK CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the milk industry is
- 2 of such importance to the economy of the State that it is in the
- 3 public interest to safeguard and protect this industry. Milk
- 4 provides an irreplaceable nutritional and dietary mainstay and
- 5 is essential for the welfare and long-term benefit of the
- 6 residents of the State, especially children and senior citizens.
- 7 While the State's milk industry is privately owned and operated,
- 8 the role of an impartial governmental agency is necessary to
- 9 regulate and oversee the interaction between producers,
- 10 processors, and if necessary, the retailers and distributors.
- 11 Before the implementation of legislation to protect the State's
- 12 milk industry, the milk industry struggled through years of
- 13 turmoil and instability, culminating in a period of hostility
- 14 between milk processors and producers that is referred to as the
- 15 "Milk Wars of the 60s".
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to strengthen the milk industry
- 17 in the State by establishing a minimum reserve requirement in
- 18 the milk control special fund that provides funding to cover all



- 1 the costs of administering the State's Milk Control Act and
- 2 specifying audits as a contingency cost covered by the minimum
- 3 reserve.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 157-29, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "[f]\$157-29[f] Milk control special fund. There is
- 7 established the milk control special fund to be administered by
- 8 the board of agriculture. All moneys received by the board of
- 9 agriculture as application fees and for licenses or otherwise
- 10 under this chapter, and any state appropriations or other moneys
- 11 made available to carry out the purposes of this chapter, shall
- 12 be deposited into the special fund. All interest earned or
- 13 accrued on moneys deposited in the special fund shall become
- 14 part of the special fund. Moneys in the special fund shall be
- 15 expended to cover all costs of administering this chapter
- 16 including but not limited to the costs of salaries, fringe
- 17 benefits, operating expenses, equipment, motor vehicles,
- 18 contracts for services, and promotional expenses. Moneys in the
- 19 special fund may be transferred to the general fund for salaries
- 20 and fringe benefits of other state employees assisting in
- 21 administering this chapter and other related costs. A reserve
- 22 in an amount of not less than \$300,000 shall be maintained in

- 1 the special fund to cover contingency costs including but not
- 2 limited to accrued vacation leave, audits, unemployment
- 3 insurance, and workers' compensation."
- 4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
