## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PACIFIC-ASIA INSTITUTE FOR RESILIENCE AND SUSTAINABILITY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to facilitate the
- 2 establishment of a revolutionary and innovative public and
- 3 private partnership to be known as the Pacific-Asia institute
- 4 for resilience and sustainability. The institute is envisioned
- 5 to provide an opportunity for a new generation of leaders to
- 6 emerge who have the ability to learn from emerging trends and to
- 7 meet global challenges. The institute's multi-disciplinary and
- 8 multi-sector approach to community resilience addresses a blind
- 9 spot in the global discourse of how nations and the people in
- 10 each nation respond to a wave of disruptive change that
- 11 permeates throughout the world.
- 12 SECTION 2. The purpose of the Pacific-Asia institute for
- 13 resilience and sustainability is to develop the next generation
- 14 of leaders to address the world's most difficult problems,
- 15 including climate change, environmental degradation, public
- 16 health, sustainable use of natural resources, critical
- 17 infrastructure protection, and cyber resilience.

1	The	institute may have an interdisciplinary and educational
2	function	that integrates science, social transformation, and
3	leadershi	p into a coherent regional framework to achieve
4	community	resilience. The institute may focus on organizing all
5	academic	disciplines, including physical sciences, social
6	sciences,	and applied sciences to address future needs. The
7	institute	may address the physical, social, and economic risks
8	and vulne	rabilities of the Pacific-Asia region that may have a
9	global im	pact; provided that the institute may address other
10	issues as	it deems appropriate or necessary.
11	SECT	ION 3. (a) Upon the establishment of the Pacific-Asia
12	institute	for resilience and sustainability, the office of the
13	lieutenan	t governor shall act as the State's liaison, assisting
14	the insti	tute to:
15	(1)	Form partnerships with various entities from the
16		public, private, and non-military sectors, including
17		but not limited to international governmental and
18		nongovernmental organizations, businesses,
19		universities, research institutes, and foundations;
20		and
21	(2)	Facilitate three core initiatives, as follows:

1		(A)	Sustainability and the environment, including
2			issues concerning energy, water, food security,
3			and climate change adaptation;
4		(B)	Global leadership and capacity building,
5			including international leadership, disaster risk
6			reduction, and public health systems; and
7		(C)	Critical community continuity, including cyber
8			security, information assurance, security
9			technology business and policy, and all levels of
10			security awareness.
11	(d)	The	institute may engage in the following activities
12	to facili	tate	the achievement of the three core initiatives,
13	using a m	ulti-	sector integration approach, as follows:
14	(1)	Esta	blishment of a named fellowship program for
15		resi	lience and sustainability that provides a
16		grad	uate-level course study for accomplished mid- and
17		seni	or-level professionals from Hawaii and the
18		Paci	fic-Asia region;
19	(2)	Esta	blishment of an interdisciplinary executive
20		mast	er's degree program to exemplify an approach that
21		is i	nclusive of all of society to address the three
22		core	initiatives; and

(3	3)	Formation of innovative hubs to provide a platform for
		applied research and analysis, consensus building, and
		problem solving on a wide variety of issues as may be
		identified from time to time by the institute. The
		hubs shall be established throughout the Pacific-Asia
		region. The hubs shall promote the integration of
		diverse expertise, research, and the development of
		innovative projects to solve verifiable problems of
		each country in the Pacific-Asia region.

- (c) The institute may pursue funding from the public and private sectors, nongovernmental organizations, and research institutes. The institute shall be eligible for grants and subsidies under chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
