RELATING TO ADULT EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 302A-435, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$302A-435[+] Financing adult and community education
4 program. (a) The financial support for this program shall be
5 in part from fees collected from students enrolled, and in part
6 from public funds appropriated for this purpose. Fees shall be
7 set in accordance with the recommendations of the advisory
8 council, and may be collected from students regularly enrolled;
9 provided that:

10 (1) Adults registered with the department of labor and
11 industrial relations and unemployed shall be granted
12 free enrollment in such courses as will tend to assist
13 these persons in securing employment;

14 (2) Adults certified by the department of human services
15 as indigent may be enrolled on a nonfee basis in
16 classes that will tend to assist these persons in
17 becoming self-sustaining;



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1	(3)	Discharged veterans who are entitled to federal
2		educational assistance shall be enrolled upon
3		authorization of the Department of Veterans Affairs
4		and fees shall be charged against federal funds in
5		accordance with Department of Veterans Affairs
6		contract regulations; and
7	(4)	Administrative and supervisory costs, costs of
8		instruction, and all other necessary expenses not
9		covered by fees and other authorized charges shall be
10		paid for out of funds appropriated for this purpose.
11	(b)	Public funds appropriated pursuant to this section for
12	the high	core program's storefront school shall be allocated to
13	the high	core program's storefront school separately from the
14	Wahiawa c	ommunity school."
