A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FEDERAL SPENDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Senator Daniel K.
Inouye's service in the United States Senate was beneficial to
the economic well-being of the State of Hawaii. Senator
Inouye's service since statehood guaranteed that Hawaii would
receive its fair share of federal spending.

6 The death of Senator Inouye has left the future of federal 7 appropriations for spending in the State of Hawaii in question, 8 including defense and transportation spending, the Pearl Harbor 9 Naval Shipyard, and the East-West Center. Furthermore, the 10 uncertain future of the United States and Hawaii economy has 11 been aggravated by the recent "fiscal cliff" negotiations and 12 the possible increase of the national debt ceiling.

13 The purpose of this Act is to establish the Hawaii federal 14 spending abatement task force to study changes in federal 15 appropriations and their economic impacts in the State following 16 the death of Senator Daniel K. Inouye, the recent "fiscal cliff" 17 negotiations, and the possible rise of the national debt

18 ceiling.
