### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to data
from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration,
alcohol-impaired driving was a factor in forty-four of the one
hundred traffic fatalities that occurred in Hawaii in 2011.

5 The use of technology is one possible mechanism for 6 reducing alcohol-related collisions. The State of New Mexico 7 recently released ENDWI (which presumably stands for "End 8 Driving While Intoxicated"), a free smartphone application that 9 allows users to estimate their ability to drive through tests 10 for responsiveness. Further, such software facilitates calls 11 for assistance from friends, family members, and taxi companies 12 for rides home. Moreover, and most importantly, the program 13 allows third parties to report their observations of erratic 14 drivers instantly.

15 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 16 transportation to develop a similar software application for 17 users in Hawaii.
