A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that accelerated driver's 2 license expiration dates for elderly drivers advance both the 3 safety of those drivers and members of the public as a whole. 4 Nevertheless, the legislature also finds that current laws have 5 created unintended consequences that impose inequitable renewal 6 requirements upon some drivers based on the timing of those 7 expiration dates. A licensee whose license expires on his or 8 her seventy-first birthday, for example, can hold a valid 9 license up to the licensee's seventy-ninth birthday if the 10 licensee obtains a renewal license on his or her seventy-first 11 birthday. A licensee may only hold a valid license up to the 12 licensee's seventy-fourth birthday, however, if he or she 13 obtains a renewal license on his or her seventy-second birthday. 14 The legislature further finds that statutory language that 15 states a license shall expire a certain number of years "after 16 the date of the issuance" of the license, if applied literally, 17 can lead to inconsistent results if applied to renewal licenses.

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- 1 birthday, for example, could hold a valid license up to his or
- 2 her eightieth birthday if the licensee obtains a renewal license
- 3 before the licensee's seventy-second birthday. Further, a
- 4 licensee whose eighty-second birthday and license expiration
- 5 date occurs on July 1, 2013, and who applies for a renewal
- 6 license on or before that date, will obtain a renewal license
- 7 that expires on July 1, 2015. If, however, the licensee applies
- 8 for renewal on July 2, 2013, the letter of the law requires a
- 9 renewal license expiration date of July 1, 2016. While the
- 10 current practices of the respective counties' examiners of
- 11 drivers may not reflect such an interpretation of the law, the
- 12 legislature finds that clarification of the law is reasonable
- 13 and prudent.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to make license expiration dates
- 15 consistent with principles of equity and clarity by:
- 16 (1) Amending the initial age of the implementation of the
- 17 accelerated license expiration dates for elderly
- 19 (2) Requiring all driver's licenses to expire when the
- 20 licensees reach the age of eighty, but maintaining the
- 21 licensees' privilege to renew; and
- 22 (3) Clarifying renewal license expiration dates by



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1	removing references to "dates of issuance" from the		
2	calculations of those dates and replacing them with		
3	references to the expiration dates of the licenses		
4	being renewed.		
5	SECTION 2. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended to read as follows:		
7	"\$286-106 Expiration of licenses. Every driver's license		
8	issued under this subpart, except for a provisional license		
9	issued under section 286-102.6 which shall expire on the date of		
10	the provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday, whether an		
11	original issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first		
12	birthday of the licensee occurring not less than eight years		
13	after the applicable reference date [of the issuance of] for the		
14	license, unless sooner revoked or suspended[; provided that:],		
15	and subject to the following conditions, listed in order of		
16	importance from least important to most important:		
17	(1) The license shall expire on the first birthday of the		
18	licensee occurring not less than four years after the		
19	applicable reference date [of the issuance] if[, at		
20	the time], on that date, the licensee is or will be		
21	twenty-four years of age or younger;		

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1	(2)	The license shall expire on the eightieth birthday of
2		the licensee;
3	[(2)]	(3) The license shall expire on the first birthday of
4		the licensee occurring not less than two years after
5		the <u>applicable reference</u> date [of the issuance of the
6		license] if[, at the time], on that date, the licensee
7		is [seventy-two] or will be eighty years of age or
8		older; and
9	[(3)]	(4) If the licensee is a legal immigrant, the license
10		shall expire no later than the <u>last date of the</u>
11		licensee's authorized period of stay in the United
12		States.
13	The e	examiner of drivers may issue a license for a shorter
14	period if	the licensee has a physical condition or conditions
15	that the e	examiner of drivers reasonably believes may impair the
16	driver's a	ability to drive.
17	For t	the purposes of this section, the "applicable reference
18	date", as	applied to an original issuance license, is the date
19	on which t	the original license was issued, and, as applied to a
20	renewal is	ssuance license, is the expiration date of the license
21	being rene	ewed."

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- 1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
