BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to allow any home-
2	schooled student to participate in extracurricular and co-

5	student attended a public school.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

13	participate in the activity; provided that any fee collected
14	pursuant to this subsection shall be used to fund the particular
15	activity for which it is charged and shall not be expended for
16	any other purpose.
17	(e) The department shall not be responsible for the
18	transportation of a home-schooled student when the student is in
19	transit from the student's home to the site of the
20	extracurricular or co-curricular activity.
21	(f) The State shall not be liable for any incident
22	occurring or injuries sustained by a home-schooled student when

3	(g) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
