A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CLIMATE CHANGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Pacific islands
region is experiencing dangerous climate change. Currently, the
most vulnerable areas include human and natural communities in
low islands, nearshore and coastal areas, and coral reefs. Some
of the most imminent and alarming concerns include:

(1) Freshwater supplies that will be more limited on many

- (1) Freshwater supplies that will be more limited on many Pacific islands as the quantity and quality of water in aquifers and surface catchments change in response to warmer, drier conditions coupled with increased occurrences of saltwater intrusion;
- (2) Rising sea levels that will increase the likelihood of coastal flooding and erosion, damaging coastal infrastructure and agriculture, negatively impacting tourism, reducing habitat for endangered species, and threatening shallow reef systems; and
- (3) Higher sea-surface temperatures that will increase coral bleaching, leading to a change in coral species

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1	composition, coral disease, coral death, and habitat
2	loss.
3	The legislature also finds that some of these changes to
4	the environment are now unavoidable and require some degree of
5	planning and adaptation. However, some of these changes can
6	still be greatly mitigated, if not prevented altogether, but
7	innovation, collaboration, and hard work are required. A
8	comprehensive evaluation of the effectiveness of alternative
9	adaptation strategies is needed to refine planning and
10	management decisions.
11	The purpose of this Act is to require the lieutenant
12	governor to convene and chair a climate change roundtable to
13	enhance the State's resilience to the myriad changes already
14	occurring and those yet to come.
15	SECTION 2. Section 26-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
17	"(d) In addition to the functions and duties provided by
18	law, the lieutenant governor shall [assume]:
19	(1) Assume administrative responsibility for the office of
20	information practices[-]; and
21	(2) Convene and chair a climate change roundtable."



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1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2014-2015 to do all things necessary in convening the
6	climate change roundtable, including hiring administrative
7	staff.
8	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
9	the lieutenant governor for the purposes of this Act.
10	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
