

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GAMBLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require the	
2	department of business, economic development, and tourism to		
3	convene a task force to perform a comprehensive analysis of the		
4	costs and benefits of various types of gambling to enable		
5	legislators to make informed decisions regarding gambling.		
6	SECTION 2. (a) The department of business, economic		
7	development, and tourism shall convene a gambling task force		
8	that shall:		
9	(1)	Analyze financial and social costs and benefits to the	
10		State of various types of gambling activities,	
11		including the lottery, casino, slots, table games,	
12	·	horse and dog racing, sports betting, bingo, and	
13		internet gaming;	
14	(2)	Assess the financial viability of the various types of	
15		gambling in the State; and	
16	(3)	Determine what percentage of each dollar put into a	
17		gambling system would likely be remitted to its	

administration, prizes, retailers, and to the State.

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1	(b)	The gambling task force shall be composed of:
2	(1)	A representative from the department of health;
3	(2)	A representative from the department of business,
4		economic development, and tourism;
5	(3)	A representative from the department of commerce and
6		consumer affairs;
7	(4)	A representative from the department of budget and
8		finance;
9	(5)	Three individuals selected by the senate president;
10		and
11	(6)	Three individuals selected by the speaker of the house
12		of representatives.
13	(c)	The task force shall be administratively attached to
14	the depar	tment of business, economic development and tourism.
15	SECT	ION 3. Members of the gambling task force shall not
16	receive c	ompensation for their service but shall be reimbursed
17	for necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in	
18	the perfo	rmance of their duties under this Act. No member shall
19	be made s	ubject to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely
20	because or	f that member's participation as a member of the task
21	force.	

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- 1 SECTION 4. The task force shall report its findings and
- 2 recommendations to the governor and the legislature no later
- 3 than October 1, 2013, and shall be dissolved on June 30, 2014.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
