

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ARRESTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 803-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$803-16 Officer of United States Customs and Border 4 Protection Service, Federal Protective Service, or Citizenship 5 and Immigration Services; arrest powers. (a) An officer of the 6 United States Customs and Border Protection Service, Federal 7 Protective Service, or the Citizenship and Immigration Services, 8 without a warrant, may arrest a person if: 9 The officer is on duty; (1)10 One or more of the following situations exists: (2) 11 (A) The person commits an assault or other crime 12 involving physical harm, defined and punishable 13 under chapter 707, against the officer or against 14 any other person in the presence of the officer; The person commits an offense against public 15 (B) 16 order, defined and punishable under chapter 711, in the presence of the officer; **17**

1	(C)	The officer has probable cause to believe that a
2		crime as provided in subparagraph (A) or (B) has
3		been committed and has probable cause to believe
4		that the person to be arrested has committed the
5		crime;
6	(D)	The officer has probable cause to believe that a
7		felony has been committed and probable cause to
8		believe that the person to be arrested has
9		committed the felony; or
10	(E)	The officer has received information by written,
11		telegraphic, teletypic, telephonic, radio, or
12		other authoritative source that a law enforcement
13		officer holds a warrant for the person's arrest[$ au$

15	(b) An o	fficer of the Federal Protective Service, without
16	a warrant, may	arrest a person if the officer is on duty and has
17	probable cause to believe that a violation of the Hawaii Penal	
18	Code, defined and punishable under title 37, has been committed	
19	and probable c	ause to believe that the person to be arrested has
20	committed the violation on or against federal property owned or	
21	possessed by the United States government and persons thereon,	
22	or any street, sidewalk, or property adjacent thereto.
