A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 35, Session Laws 2 of Hawaii 2010, established new minimum qualification licensing 3 requirements for electricians effective July 1, 2013. The 4 legislature further finds that most in-state electrical workers 5 are experienced in low voltage work, which includes wiring buildings at one hundred twenty/two hundred forty volts. There 6 are not enough electricians, splicers, and linemen in the State 7 8 who are experienced and qualified to work with high voltage, 9 over four hundred eighty volts, and who could respond in the 10 event of a catastrophic occurrence or complex maintenance work affecting an electric utility. 11

The legislature additionally finds that Act 35 has had 12 13 inadvertent consequences. In an emergency situation, it could 14 be necessary to engage contractors who use personnel licensed in other states. However, under the licensing requirements 15 16 established by Act 35, the necessary personnel would not be 17 certified in Hawaii and would be prohibited from offering 18 The legislature concludes that there are potential assistance. 2013-0821 HB SMA.doc

impacts to the health and safety of the State and its residents, 1 2 and a specific exception to the licensing requirements for 3 electrical contractors is therefore needed. 4 The purpose of this Act is to provide an exception to the 5 licensing requirements for electrical contractors in situations 6 when an electric utility must hire contractors licensed in 7 another state to assist with high voltage work. 8 SECTION 2. Section 448E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 9 "§448E-5 Minimum requirements. (a) Except as otherwise 10 provided in subsection (b), an applicant shall possess the 11 12 following minimum gualifications: Journey worker electrician: To be eligible for the 13 (1) 14 journey worker electrician examination, an applicant 15 shall be at least eighteen years of age and shall 16 provide satisfactory evidence of experience in 17 residential or commercial wiring of at least five 18 years full-time or its equivalent, but not less than 19 ten thousand hours, in the trade under the supervision of a journey worker or supervising electrician; 20 21 Journey worker specialty electrician: To be eligible (2)22 for the journey worker specialty electrician



1 examination, an applicant shall be at least eighteen 2 years of age and shall provide satisfactory evidence 3 of at least five years' experience in the trade; 4 (3) Supervising electrician: To be eligible for the 5 supervising electrician examination, an applicant shall have been registered with the board as a journey 6 7 worker electrician for at least a period of four years 8 or shall have equivalent experience in the trade; 9 (4)Supervising specialty electrician: To be eligible for 10 the supervising specialty electrician examination, an 11 applicant shall have been registered with the board as 12 a journey worker specialty electrician for at least a 13 period of four years or shall have equivalent 14 experience in the trade; 15 Journey worker plumber: To be eligible for the (5) 16 journey worker plumber examination, an applicant shall 17 provide satisfactory evidence of experience of at 18 least five years' full-time or its equivalent, but not 19 less than ten thousand hours, as a journey worker's or 20 master plumber's helper;

21 (6) Master plumber: To be eligible for the master plumber
22 examination, an applicant shall have been registered



1 with the board as a journey worker plumber for at 2 least two years or shall have equivalent experience in 3 the trade; 4 (7)Maintenance electrician: To be eligible for the 5 maintenance electrician examination, an applicant 6 shall be not less than eighteen years of age and shall 7 provide satisfactory evidence of at least one year of 8 experience in performing electrical maintenance work 9 or two years of schooling in the electrical trade; (8) Journey worker industrial electrician: To be eligible 10 11 for the journey worker industrial electrician 12 examination, an applicant shall be at least eighteen 13 years of age and shall provide satisfactory evidence 14 of experience in industrial electrical work of at 15 least five years full-time or its equivalent, but not 16 less than ten thousand hours; 17 (9) Supervising industrial electrician: To be eligible 18 for the supervising industrial electrician examination, an applicant shall have been registered 19 with the board as a journey worker industrial 20 21 electrician for a period of at least four years or 22 shall have equivalent experience in the trade.

Effective July 1, 2013, an applicant for licensing 1 (b) 2 pursuant to this chapter shall possess the following minimum 3 qualifications: 4 (1)Journey worker electrician: To be eligible for the 5 journey worker electrician examination, an applicant 6 shall be at least eighteen years of age and shall 7 provide satisfactory evidence of: 8 (A) Experience in residential or commercial wiring of 9 at least five years full-time or its equivalent, 10 but not less than ten thousand hours, in the 11 trade under the supervision of a journey worker 12 or supervising electrician; and 13 (B) Satisfactory completion, accepted by a University 14 of Hawaii community college offering an 15 appropriate program of study, of two hundred 16 forty hours of electrical academic coursework; 17 (2)Journey worker specialty electrician: To be eligible 18 for the journey worker specialty electrician 19 examination, an applicant shall be at least eighteen 20 years of age and shall provide satisfactory evidence 21 of:
