RELATING TO ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 269-101.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$269-101.5[+] Maximum capacity of eligible customer4 generator. The eligible customer-generator shall have a
5 capacity of not more than [fifty] ______ kilowatts; provided
6 that the public utilities commission may increase the maximum
7 allowable capacity that eligible customer-generators may have to
8 an amount greater than [fifty] ______ kilowatts by rule or
9 order."

10 SECTION 2. Section 269-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as 12 follows:

13 "\$269-102 Standard contract or tariff; competitive bidding 14 process; rate structure. (a) Every electric utility shall 15 develop a standard contract or tariff providing for net energy 16 metering and shall make this contract available to eligible 17 customer-generators, upon request, [on a first-come first served 18 basis] until the time that the total rated generating capacity HB HMS 2013-1051

1 bidder whose bid meets the requirements and criteria 2 set forth in the invitation for bids. 3 Notwithstanding the generating capacity requirements of 4 this subsection, the public utilities commission may evaluate, 5 on an island-by-island basis, the applicability of the 6 generating capacity requirements of this subsection and, in its 7 discretion, may exempt an island or a utility grid system from the generating capacity requirements." 8 9 SECTION 3. Section 269-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "§269-104 Additional customer-generators. Notwithstanding 12 section 269-102, an electric utility is not obligated to provide 13 net energy metering to additional customer-generators in its 14 service area when the combined total peak generating capacity of 15 all eligible customer-generators served by all the electric 16 utilities in that service area furnishing net energy metering to 17 eligible customer-generators equals [.5] per cent of the 18 system peak demand of those electric utilities; provided that 19 the public utilities commission may increase, by rule or order, 20 the allowable percentage of the electric utility's system peak 21 demand produced from eligible customer-generators in the 22 electric utility's service area, whereupon the electric utility



1 will be obligated to provide net energy metering to additional 2 eligible customer-generators in that service area up to the 3 increased percentage amount."

4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

This Act shall take effect upon its approval. SECTION 5.
