A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State requires a plan to relocate public safety services located within and 2 3 nearby inundation zones to a centralized non-inundation zone 4 area that will provide direct access to highways and be in 5 convenient proximity to hospital and military services and 6 In the event of a major disaster, critical systems assistance. could be unavailable for months, negatively impacting the lives 7 8 of many tens of thousands of citizens and costing the State tens 9 of millions of dollars in unplanned system recovery and restart 10 costs. 11 The legislature further finds that the State's current data 12 center environment is not fulfilling the capacity, reliability, and security needs of the various departments. The existence of 13 14 more than thirty low-quality data centers, which are poorly secured and monitored and completely unmanned more than sixty-15 16 five per cent of the time, exposes the State to the possibility 17 of significant physical and cyber security breaches, resulting 18 in the loss of confidential information about our most



- 1 vulnerable citizens. Compromising citizens' security and
- 2 damaging the reputation of the State as a trustworthy data
- 3 custodian could expose the State to tens of millions of dollars
- 4 in liability and remediation costs.
- 5 The legislature further finds that the high technology
- 6 development corporation in collaboration with the department of
- 7 accounting and general services and chief information officer,
- 8 has the ability to oversee the design, construction, and
- 9 operation of a data center that can house the State's
- 10 centralized computing resources along with key staff that
- 11 support and maintain these resources.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to centralize first responders
- 13 and cyber security facilities to enable the sharing of resources
- 14 and support services by establishing a central Oahu first
- 15 responders technology campus and cyber security command center.
- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 206M, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 "PART . FIRST RESPONDERS TECHNOLOGY CAMPUS AND CYBER
- 20 SECURITY COMMAND CENTER
- 21 §206M- First responders technology campus and cyber
- 22 security command center; established. There is established a



- 1 central Oahu first responders technology campus and cyber
- 2 security command center that shall include properties identified
- 3 by the following tax map key numbers: 9-5-002-057; 9-5-046-010;
- 4 9-5-046-018; 9-5-046-041; and 9-5-046-042. The first responders
- 5 technology campus and cyber security command center shall be
- 6 administered by the board.
- 7 §206M- Objective of the first responders technology
- 8 campus and cyber security command center. The objective of the
- 9 first responders technology campus and cyber security command
- 10 center shall be to centralize first responders and cyber
- 11 security facilities to enable the sharing of resources and
- 12 support services.
- 13 §206M- Guidelines. (a) The board shall work with the
- 14 department of accounting and general services and the chief
- 15 information officer to design and develop the first responders
- 16 technology campus and cyber security command center.
- 17 (b) The chief information officer shall enter into
- 18 memoranda of understanding with the following agencies:
- 19 (1) Department of defense; provided that the department is
- 20 allocated acres for facilities;
- 21 (2) Department of public safety; provided that the
- 22 department is allocated acres for facilities;

2		allocated acres for facilities;
3	(4)	City and county of Honolulu department of emergency

15	(C)	Agencies and services shall enter into interagency
16	agreement	s where efforts might be duplicated.
17	(d)	The first responders technology campus and cyber
18	security	command center shall include:
19	(1)	acres for a data center that is located on a
20		site that is away from flood and tsunami hazard zones
21		and is supplied with reliable electric power and many
22		diverse and redundant high speed telecommunications

1		connections; provided that the data center is an
2		energy efficient, green facility with a smaller
3		environmental footprint than existing data centers;
4		provided further that the data center include an
5		eight-thousand-to-ten-thousand-square-foot computer
6		room with two-hundred fifty racks, an electric power
7		load of two megawatts total for information technology
8 .		equipment, and a tier 3 reliability rating;
9	(2)	Ten acres dedicated for an innovation and research
10		facility;
11	(3)	Forty acres dedicated for a sheriff facility that
12		includes a headquarters building for administrative
13		offices, conference rooms, and an emergency operations
14		center and a training facility for classrooms, a gym,
15		emergency vehicle operations course, mock crime scene
16		facility, SWAT house for tactical training, and
17		dormitories; and
18	(4)	acres dedicated for a state fire council
19		facility that includes a building dedicated to public
20		safety training; warehouses for proper storage of
21		vehicles, equipment, and supplies; fire training
22		building; rappelling towerburn building; urban search

1	and	rescue sets; helicopter landing field and training
2	area	a; driving course; wellness, fitness, and training
3	area	as; gymnasium; swimming and diving pool; athletic
