### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

15	(1) The minor first informs a tattoo artist, as defined in

- (5) Aiding or abetting an unlicensed person, knowingly combining or conspiring with an unlicensed person, allowing one's license to be used by an unlicensed person, or acting as agent or associate of an unlicensed person to evade the use of title restrictions of this part;
- (6) Tattooing any person under the age of eighteen without the written consent of the person's parent or legal guardian or not maintaining the consent forms in a confidential manner [at the tattoo shop] for not less than two years; or
- (7) Making a false or misleading statement to the department relating to any matter under this part."
- SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun before its effective date.
- 20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

#### Report Title:

Tattoos; Minors; Parent or Guardian Consent

#### Description:

Prior to the application of a tattoo for a minor, requires a tattoo artist to inform the prospective client that the consent of a parent or guardian is required for a minor, ascertain identification of the prospective client's minor status, and obtain the written consent of a parent or guardian. Makes it a petty misdemeanor to apply a tattoo to a minor without the written consent of parent or guardian.
