A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOBILITY MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that all of Hawaii's
2	residents - including elders and individuals with disabilities
3	should be able to live at home with the supports they need so
4	that they may participate in communities that value their
5	contributions. A goal of the executive office on aging is to
6	increase access to community supports and full participation,
7	while focusing attention and resources on the unique needs of
8	older adults and people with disabilities. For example, the
9	executive office on aging, in partnership with the county
10	offices on aging, is transforming Hawaii's home and community
11	based services system through the establishment of aging and
12	disability resource centers; this is testimony to their
13	commitment to promote community living and to find new
14	mechanisms to help ensure that the supports elders and
15	individuals with disabilities need to live in the community are
16	accessible.
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The legislature also finds that statewide, especially in rural communities, many residents are without family members

- 1 nearby to provide transportation and are too frail or disabled
- 2 to access public transit. Transportation services are often
- 3 fragmented, underutilized, or difficult to navigate, and can be
- 4 costly because of inconsistent, duplicative, and often
- 5 restrictive federal and state program rules and regulations.
- 6 Due to these circumstances, there is a need for a policy on
- 7 mobility management, a concept under which a single entity in a
- 8 geographical area is charged with knowing and deploying the
- 9 entire array of transportation resources available. Such a
- 10 system would focus on the individual and identify the best
- 11 transportation options, both public and private, for that
- 12 person's travel needs.
- 13 The legislature further finds mobility management services
- 14 help to maximize the use of intelligent transportation systems
- 15 and other technology to enhance mobility and create one-call
- 16 systems that allow greater ease-of-use for customers.
- 17 Consequently, the legislature believes that a task force is
- 18 needed to analyze and make recommendations on state-level policy
- 19 on mobility management.
- The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force on
- 21 mobility management.

1	SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the departmen			
2	of health	a task force on mobility management to make		
3	recommendations on establishing a transportation framework to			
4	assist elders and individuals with disabilities with			
5	transportation needs in rural communities, including			
6	recommendations relating to the state budget and program			
7	development.			
8	(b)	The task force on mobility management shall consider:		
9	(1)	Developing and establishing a program under which a		
10		single entity in a geographical area is charged with		
11		administering an array of transportation resources;		
12	(2)	The cost and qualifications of transportation		
13		coordinators or operators and the logistics of the		
14		arrangements and delivery of transportation services,		
15		including costs reimbursements, insurance, and		
16		liability; and		
17	(3)	Develop a mobility management master plan for each		
18		county to:		
19		(A) Address the growing demands for transportation		
20		services;		
21		(B) Encourage living at home;		

1	(C)	Improve efficiencies in the use of public and
2		private sector vehicles; and
3	(D)	Make use of modern technology in the management
4		of transportation services.
5	(c) As	a part of developing mobility management master
6	plans, the ta	sk force on mobility management shall also consider
7	including in	the mobility management master plan framework a
8	transportatio	n service component that utilizes the
9	transportatio	n resources of nonprofit organizations that are
10	willing to pa	rticipate in a vehicle-sharing network to provide
11	on-call trans	portation services to elders and individuals with
12	disabilities	residing in rural communities.
13	(d) The	task force shall consist of the following members,
14	or their desi	gnees:
15	(1) The	director of the executive office on aging, who
16	sha	ll serve as chairperson of the task force;
17	(2) The	chairperson of the public utilities commission, or
18	the	chairperson's designee;
19	(3) The	executive director of the disability and
20	com	munication access board;
21	(4) The	chief executive officer of the Hawaii Primary Care
22	Ass	ociation;

1	(5)	An administrator of a federally qualified health		
2		center or rural health clinic, to be appointed by the		
3		director of the executive office on aging;		
4	(6)	The director of transportation services from each of		
5		the four counties;		
6	(7)	One member of the house of representatives to be		
7		designated by the speaker of the house of		
8		representatives;		
9	(8)	One member of the senate to be designated by the		
10		president of the senate; and		
11	(9)	One representative from each area agency on aging of		
12		the four counties.		
13	(e)	The department of health, through the executive office		
14	on aging,	shall submit an interim report of the task force's		
15	recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the			
16	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of			
17	the regular session of 2014, and a final report of the task			
18	force's recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to			
19	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening			
20	of the re	gular session of 2015.		

(f) Members of the task force shall not be compensated for

their service on the task force but shall be reimbursed for

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- 1 reasonable expenses, including travel expenses, incurred for
- 2 serving on the task force.
- The task force shall be dissolved on June 30, 2015. 3
- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$30,000, or so much 5
- thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014, and the 6
- sum of \$60,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for 7
- 8 fiscal year 2014-2015 for the staffing, operation, and convening
- 9 of the task force on mobility management.
- 10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 11 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
