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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOPEDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 249-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
3	"(a) Bicycles having two tandem wheels that are twenty		
4	inches or more in diameter [and all mopeds] are required to be		
5	registered and shall be subject to a permanent registration fee		
6	of \$15, to be paid by the owners thereof to the director of		
7	finance. All mopeds are required to be registered on a		
8	staggered basis based upon the month of initial registration and		
9	shall be subject to an annual registration fee of \$15, to be		
10	paid by the owners thereof to the director of finance. The		
11	owner of the moped shall submit a current official certificate		
12	of inspection, issued under section 286-26, as part of the		
13	registration process."		
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
15	amended by amending the title of part II to read as follows:		
16	"PART II. INSPECTION OF VEHICLES AND MOPEDS"		
17	SECTION 3. Section 286-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
18	amended to read as follows:		
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1 "§286-21 Vehicles and mopeds without required equipment or 2 in unsafe condition. No person shall drive or cause to move on 3 any highway any motor vehicle, moped, trailer, semitrailer, or 4 pole trailer, or any combination thereof, unless the equipment 5 thereon is in good working order and adjustment as required in 6 this part [so as not to] and does not endanger the driver or 7 other occupant or any person [upon] on the highway." 8 SECTION 4. Section 286-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsections (a) to (c) to read as follows: 9 10 "(a) [The chief of police or any police officer of any 11 county may, at] At any time when the chief of police or police 12 officer has reasonable cause to believe that a vehicle or moped is unsafe or not equipped as required by law, the chief of 13 14 police or any police officer of any county may require the owner 15 or driver of the vehicle or moped to submit the vehicle or moped to an inspection or make the necessary corrections or repairs. 16 17 If the vehicle or moped is found to be in an unsafe (b) 18 condition or if any required part or equipment is not present or 19 if any required part or equipment is present but not in proper 20 repair, the officer shall issue a citation to the owner or 21 driver stating the reasons that the vehicle is deemed unsafe or 22 the moped is deemed unsafe or not equipped as required and shall HB1324 HD2 HMS 2013-2491 

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require that a new certificate of inspection as provided in
 section 286-26 be obtained within five days or that the defect
 be cured.

4 If upon inspection, the chief of police or any police (C) 5 officer determines that any vehicle or moped is in such unsafe 6 condition as to constitute a menace to the public or determines 7 that the moped is not equipped as required in this part and 8 cannot reasonably be restored to a safe condition or with 9 respect to mopeds, equipped as required in this part, the chief 10 of police or police officer shall remove the sticker [which] 11 that signifies the certificate of inspection and, with regard to 12 vehicles, inform the director of finance, who shall [forthwith] 13 immediately suspend the registration of the vehicle and give 14 notice of the suspension to its owner. Whenever the director of 15 finance has suspended the registration of any vehicle under this 16 part, the owner of the vehicle shall immediately surrender and 17 forward to the director of finance the certificate of 18 registration and the license plates last issued upon 19 registration of the vehicle for the current year." 20 SECTION 5. Section 286-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

21 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:



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1 (b) No person shall operate any vehicle or moped after 2 receiving a citation with reference thereto as provided in 3 section 286-22(b), except that if the driver is authorized to do 4 so by the police officer, the driver may return the vehicle or 5 moped to the driver's residence or place of business or the 6 residence or place of business of the owner of the vehicle  $[\tau]$  or 7 moped, or to an automotive repair shop, if within a distance of 8 twenty miles, until a certificate of inspection is obtained or 9 the necessary corrections or repairs are made."

SECTION 6. Section 286-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, isamended to read as follows:

12 "§286-24 [Registered\_owner's responsibility; registration 13 plates as prima facie evidence as to the fault of the registered 14 owner.] Responsibility of owner or operator for violation. In 15 any proceeding for violation of this part, the registered owner 16 of a vehicle or the owner or operator of a moped shall be deemed 17 responsible for the unsafe condition of the vehicle[-] or moped, 18 or of the failure to equip the moped as required by law."

19 SECTION 7. Section 286-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is20 amended to read as follows:

 21 "\$286-25 Operation of a vehicle <u>or moped</u> without a
 22 certificate of inspection. Whoever operates, permits the HB1324 HD2 HMS 2013-2491

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operation of, causes to be operated, or parks any vehicle or
 <u>moped</u> on a public highway without a current official certificate
 of inspection, issued under section 286-26, shall be fined not
 more than \$100."

5 SECTION 8. Section 286-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended as follows:

7 1. By amending subsections (b) and (c) to read:

8 "(b) [All other] Mopeds and vehicles[7] other than those 9 under subsection (a), including motorcycles, trailers, 10 semitrailers, and pole trailers having a gross vehicle weight rating of [10,000] ten thousand pounds or less, and antique 11 12 motor vehicles as defined in section 249-1, except those in 13 subsections (c) and (d), shall be certified as provided in 14 subsection (e) every twelve months; provided that any vehicle or 15 moped to which this subsection applies shall not require 16 inspection within two years of the date on which the vehicle was first sold. 17

(c) Any vehicle <u>or moped</u> that has been involved in an
accident shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) before
it is operated again if:

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1	(1) It is determined by a police officer or an insurer
2	that the vehicle's equipment has been damaged so as to
3	render the vehicle unsafe; or
4	(2) It is rebuilt or restored."
5	2. By amending subsections (e) through (g) to read:
6	"(e) Upon application for a certificate of inspection to
7	be issued for a vehicle[ $ au$ ] or moped, an inspection as prescribed
8	by the director under subsection (g) shall be conducted on the
9	vehicle[ $\tau$ ] or moped, and if the vehicle or moped is found to be
10	in a safe operating condition, a certificate of inspection shall
11	be issued upon payment of a fee to be determined by the
12	director. The certificate for a motor vehicle shall state the
13	effective date, the termination date, the name of the issuing
14	insurance carrier, and the policy number of the motor vehicle
15	insurance identification card for the inspected motor vehicle as
16	specified by section 431:10C-107 or state the information
17	contained in the proof of insurance card as specified by section
18	431:10G-106. A sticker, authorized by the director, shall be
19	affixed to the vehicle or moped at the time a certificate of
20	inspection is issued. An inspection sticker [ <del>which</del> ] that has
21	been lost, stolen, or destroyed shall be replaced without
22	reinspection by the inspection station that issued the original
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inspection sticker upon presentation of the [vehicle's] current certificate of inspection[+] for the vehicle or moped; provided that the current certificate of inspection and inspection sticker shall not have expired at the time the replacement is requested. The director shall adopt rules to determine the fee for replacement of lost, stolen, or destroyed inspection stickers.

8 The operator of an official inspection station shall (f) 9 pay, from the fee in subsection (e), an amount to be determined 10 by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91 to the director of 11 transportation. This amount shall be expended only for 12 administration and enforcement of the periodic motor vehicle and 13 moped inspection program. The funds collected pursuant to this 14 subsection shall be deposited into the highway special fund. The director of transportation shall adopt necessary 15 (g) 16 rules for the administration of inspections and the issuance of 17 certificates of inspection[-]; provided that mopeds manufactured 18 after December 31, 2013, shall be issued a certificate of 19 inspection only if the exhaust system of the moped meets the 20 specifications of the original manufacturer, and all other 21 applicable requirements for the issuance of a certificate of

22 inspection are satisfied."

2	amended t	o read as follows:		
3	"§28	6-30 False certificates. Any person who makes,		
4	issues, o	r knowingly uses any imitation or counterfeit of an		
5	official	certificate of inspection, or any person who displays		
6	or causes or permits to be displayed upon any vehicle or moped			
7	any certificate of inspection knowing the same to be issued for			
8	another vehicle or issued without an inspection having been made			
9	or issued without authority as provided herein shall be fined			
10	[ <del>not more than</del> ] <u>up to</u> \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than thirty			
11	days, or both."			
12	SECTION 10. Section 291C-194, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
13	amended a	s follows:		
14	1.	By amending subsection (a) to read:		
15	(a)	"No person shall drive a moped unless the person:		
16	(1)	Possesses a valid driver's license of any category		
17		listed in section 286-102 or 286-239; [and]		
18	(2)	Meets the requirements of section 286-105(3)[-]; and		
19	<u>(3)</u>	Has taken and passed a moped education course approved		
20		by the department of transportation."		
21	2.	By amending subsection (c) to read:		



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1	"(c) Any person who is convicted of violating this section
2	shall be subject to penalties as provided under section 291C-
3	161(b) and [+](f)[+]."
4	SECTION 11. Section 291C-206, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
6	"(b) Any person who violates this section shall be fined
7	not more than [ <del>\$500.</del> ] <u>\$1,000.</u> "
8	SECTION 12. This Act does not affect rights and duties
9	that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
10	were begun before its effective date.
11	SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2014.



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#### Report Title:

Mopeds; Registration; Safety Inspections; Safety Courses; Fines

#### Description:

Requires annual registration and inspection of mopeds. Requires operators of mopeds to enroll in safety courses in order to operate their mopeds. Increases the fine for modifying a moped to \$1,000. Effective January 1, 2014. (HB1324 HD2)
