A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE AGENCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 171-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: The board of land and natural resources shall be 3 "(a) composed of [seven] nine members, one appointed by the board of 4 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs to represent the 5 6 interests of the office of Hawaiian affairs; one from each land 7 district; and [three] four at large, to be nominated and, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the 8 9 governor as provided in section 26-34. The term and removal of 10 a member of the board and the filling of a vacancy on the board shall also be as provided in section 26-34. There shall be not 11 12 more than three members on the board from the same political 13 party. At least one member of the board shall have a background 14 in conservation and natural resources, as evidenced by: 15 (1) A college degree in a relevant field, including 16 forestry, wildlife conservation, geology, 17 environmental science, or marine biology; or

 - (1) At least one member shall have substantial experience or expertise in traditional Hawaiian water resource management techniques and in traditional Hawaiian
