A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEBT COLLECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amende
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	"§28- Civil recoveries fund. (a) There is established
5	In the state treasury the civil recoveries fund into which shall
6	pe deposited:
7	(1) per cent of any moneys collected by the
8	attorney general for any executive department, any
9	executive agency, or the judiciary for a delinquent
10	account turned over for collection pursuant to section
11	40-82.5(b); and
12	(2) Appropriations made by the legislature.
13	(b) The civil recoveries fund shall be administered by the
14	department of the attorney general and shall be used for
15	expenditures relating to the collection of delinquent accounts
16	of executive departments, executive agencies, or the judiciary,
17	including expenditures for training or educational resources.

- 2 and litigation costs.
- 3 (c) The department of the attorney general shall submit a
- 4 report to the legislature no later than September 1 of each year
- 5 to provide an accounting of the receipts and expenditures of the
- 6 fund."
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 40-82.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "\$40-82.5 Delinquent accounts, collection. (a) Any state
- 10 agency having an account due which is delinquent, may contract
- 11 with a collection agency bonded under chapter 443B for
- 12 collection of the delinquent account. The chairperson or
- 13 director of the agency may make an agreement with the agency
- 14 regarding the amount to be retained by it for services.
- 15 (b) Any executive department, any executive agency, or the
- 16 judiciary, having an account due that is delinquent more than
- 17 ninety days, may turn the delinquent account over to the
- 18 attorney general for collection. For all accounts successfully
- 19 collected for an executive department, an executive agency, or
- 20 the judiciary by the attorney general, the attorney general
- 21 shall retain per cent to be deposited into the civil
- 22 recoveries fund in accordance with section 28- (a)(1), and the

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- 1 remainder of the moneys collected shall be returned to the
- 2 executive department, executive agency, or judiciary, to be
- 3 deposited into the fund or expended for the purpose for which it
- 4 was originally intended."
- 5 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

Attorney General; Collection of Delinquent Accounts

Description:

Authorizes any executive department, executive agency, or the Judiciary to turn over to the Attorney General for collection, delinquent accounts that are more than ninety days past due. Deposits an unspecified percentage of the amounts collected into the Civil Recoveries Fund. Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1342 HD2)

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
