A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	" <u>\$</u> 29	1C- Failure to yield right-of-way to mass transit
5	vehicle;	penalty. (a) A person commits the offense of failure
6	to yield	the right-of-way to a mass transit vehicle entering
7	traffic i	f the person does not yield the right-of-way to a mass
8	transit v	ehicle when:
9	(1)	A yield sign as described in subsection (b) is
10		displayed on the back of the mass transit vehicle;
11	(2)	The person is operating a vehicle that is overtaking
12		the mass transit vehicle from the rear; and
13	<u>(3)</u>	The mass transit vehicle, after stopping to receive or
14		discharge passengers, is signaling an intention to
15		enter the traffic lane occupied by the person
16		operating the vehicle.
17	(b)	If a yield sign is displayed on a mass transit
18	vehicle,	it shall warn a person operating a motor vehicle
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- 1 approaching the rear of a mass transit vehicle that the person
- 2 must yield when the vehicle is entering traffic. The yield sign
- 3 shall be illuminated by a flashing light when the vehicle is
- 4 signaling an intention to enter a traffic lane after stopping
- 5 for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers.
- 6 The department of transportation shall adopt rules pursuant
- 7 to chapter 91 to determine:
- 8 (1) The message on the yield sign;
- 9 (2) Specifications for the size, shape, color, lettering,
- and illumination of the sign; and
- 11 (3) Specifications for the placement of the sign on a mass
- transit vehicle.
- 13 (c) This section shall not relieve a driver of a mass
- 14 transit vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the
- 15 safety of all persons using the roadway.
- 16 (d) Any person who violates this section shall be fined
- 17 not more than \$.
- (e) Not more than thirty days after the end of each fiscal
- 19 quarter, the state director of finance shall transmit to the
- 20 respective department of transportation of the county in which
- 21 the violation occurred, all fines collected under this section.



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1 (f) All fines received under this section by the county department of transportation shall be used to purchase mass 2 3 transit passes for homeless individuals; provided that the county department of transportation shall adopt rules pursuant 4 5 to chapter 91 to carry out this subsection. 6 (g) For purposes of this section: 7 "Homeless" means the same as defined under section 346-361. "Mass transit vehicle" means the same as defined under 8 9 section 291-11.6." 10 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 12 begun before its effective date. 13 SECTION 3. Mass Transit Vehicle Right of Way; Violation; Penalty

Description:

Establishes the offense of failure to yield right-of-way to mass transit vehicles and requires the Department of Transportation to develop a system of yield signage on mass transit vehicles. Directs all fines to be used to purchase mass transit passes for homeless individuals. Effective January 1, 2014.

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
