A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BICYCLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part XIII to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§291C- Carriage of bicycles on public transportation
5	vehicles. A bicycle may be carried on a vehicle used in a
6	public transportation system only if it meets the following
7	general specifications:
8	(1) Wheel base not longer than forty-four inches;
9	(2) Tires not more than 2.3 inches wide;
10	(3) Wheel diameters not less than twenty inches; and
11	(4) Total weight not more than fifty-five pounds."
12	SECTION 2. Section 291C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by amending the definition of "bicycle" to read as
14	follows:
15	""Bicycle" means every vehicle [propelled solely by human
16	power] upon which any person may ride, having two tandem wheels,
17	and including any vehicle generally recognized as a bicycle

1	though equipped with two front or two rear wheels, except a toy
2	bicycle[-], that is:
3	(1) Propelled solely by human power; or
4	(2) Propelled by an electric motor that:
5	(A) Produces less than seven hundred fifty watts (1
6	horsepower); and
7	(B) Is capable of propelling the vehicle at a maximum
8	speed of less than twenty miles per hour on a
9	<pre>paved level surface."</pre>
10	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
