RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's 2 agricultural community is essential to the sustainability of our 3 local economy. Our farmers provide locally produced foods and 4 products that reduce our dependence on imported goods, decrease 5 our vulnerability to food supply disruptions caused by natural 6 disasters or worldwide economic events, reduce our use of fossil 7 fuels, and keep money in our communities. Despite the merits of 8 local agriculture, the legislature further finds that many 9 Hawaii farmers are struggling financially, due in large part to 10 their inability to compete with outside products, which often 11 have lower production costs.

12 The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force that 13 shall develop strategies to empower Hawaii's agricultural 14 community to compete with imported products.

15 SECTION 2. (a) Beginning no later than January 1, 2014, 16 the department of agriculture shall convene a task force to 17 develop strategies that will enable Hawaii's agricultural 18 community to compete with imported products.

9		dean's designated representative;
10	(4)	A representative of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation;

12	(5)	Any other member that the department of agriculture
13		chooses to designate.
14	(c)	The task force shall:
15	(1)	Assess the State's agricultural industry and assess the
16		availability of financial capital to support Hawaii's
17		agricultural community competing in national and
18		international agricultural markets;
19	(2)	Assess the ability of farmers and livestock producers
20		to form bargaining and marketing cooperatives in the
21		State;



1	_, (3)	Examine the availability of accurate trade statistics,
2		including current market prices and trends, for various
3		agricultural products and commodities consumed in and
4		exported out of the State;
5	(4)	Explore and propose strategies that will allow Hawaii's
6		agricultural community to compete with imported
7		products, that shall include but not be limited to:
8		(A) Giving qualifying farmers tax breaks on
9		agricultural equipment and supplies in order to
10		lower their production costs;
11		(B) Giving retailers financial and other incentives to
12		sell Hawaii-grown agricultural products at a
13		discount to consumers; and
14		(C) Exempting end-use consumers of Hawaii-grown
15		agricultural products from having to pay general
16		excise tax on such products; and
17	(5)	Assess any other areas or matters that require
18		consideration by the task force that will allow the
19		local agricultural community to compete with imported
20		products.
