A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding three new sections to subpart B of part II t
3	be appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Student-to-teacher ratios; established. (a)
5	Each public school shall maintain a student-to-teacher ratio
6	between thirteen to seventeen students per teacher for every
7	grade level from kindergarten to the eighth grade.
8	(b) The student-to-teacher ratios of each public school
9	shall be posted on the website of the department.
10	§302A- Classroom composition; heterogeneity. The
11	department shall provide a statewide flexible system of
12	educational placement and programs within the public school
13	system that the department determines is necessary to achieve
14	heterogeneity with regard to scholastic aptitude in the
15	composition of each class in a public school.
16	<u>§302A-</u> <u>Textbooks; instruction.</u> The department shall
17	not use any textbook for classroom instruction that was
18	published more than two years prior to the school year."

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding three new sections to subpart C of part II to
3	be appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- AVID; expansion. (a) The department shall
5	implement the Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID)
6	program in all grade levels of public schools to enable students
7	in the lower eightieth percentile academically to achieve
8	international competitiveness.
9	(b) The AVID program shall:
10	(1) Identify challenge areas for each student;
11	(2) Assist and mentor each student in overcoming those
12	challenges;
13	(3) Follow up with each student on the student's
14	assignments to ensure their completion; and
15	(4) Assist each student, through direct tutorial
16	assistance or otherwise, in subject matter areas for
17	which the student falls below a proficiency rating of
18	eighty per cent.
19	(c) Except for students who rank in the academic top
20	twenty per cent of each class, every student in a public school
21	shall attend one classroom period per day devoted to the AVID
22	program.

1	<u>§302</u>	A- Internet access. The department shall provide		
2	high-spee	d internet access in each classroom to supplement		
3	curriculum and instruction.			
4	<u>§302</u>	A- Community involvement. Each public school shall		
5	seek comm	unity involvement to increase student performance		
6	outcomes."			
7	SECT	ION 3. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended b	y adding two new sections to subpart B of part IV to be		
9	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:		
10	" <u>§</u> 30:	2A- Department website; mandatory information. (a)		
11	The depar	tment shall maintain on its public website the		
12	following	information on each public school:		
13	(1)	The nature of community involvement at each public		
14		school;		
15	(2)	The allocation of federal and state funds at each		
16		<pre>public school;</pre>		
17	<u>(3)</u>	A description or organizational chart of the		
18		administrative structure of each public school within		
19		the department of education;		
20	(4)	An explanation of the test results of any public		
21		school or any other information about that school that		

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1		appears on the department's website, when requested by
2		the principal of another public school;
3	<u>(5)</u>	The student-to-teacher ratios of each public school;
4	(6)	Aggregated students' test results in reading, writing,
5		mathematics, and science for each public school;
6	<u>(7)</u>	The school's approach to achieving international
7		competitiveness; and
8	<u>(8)</u>	The department's evaluation of each public school with
9		regard to that public school's success rate in
10		achieving international competitiveness including any
11		obstacles; provided that a public school's success
12		rate shall be deemed to be the rate of change of
13		student performance with regard to achieving
14		international competitiveness.
15	<u>(b)</u>	The department shall also maintain on its public
16	website a	t least the following on the public school system:
17	<u>(1)</u>	Teacher support practices by school districts,
18		including teacher development, teacher assessment,
19	•	teacher training, teaching models, instructional
20	·	materials, and other tools and techniques to assist
21		teachers at improving student performance outcomes;

1	(2)	A brief but adequate description from the department
2		administration of curriculum frameworks based upon the
3		most up-to-date techniques on how students learn; and
4	(3)	Teacher-parent communication activities and crucial
5		support services from governmental and non-
6		governmental entities.
7	<u>§302</u>	A- External assistance. The department shall
8	assign ac	credited external assistance, as determined by the
9	departmen	t, to any public school that does not show improvement
10	in two co	nsecutive years at increasing student performance
11	outcomes	in achieving international competitiveness."
12	SECT	ION 4. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended b	y adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
14	and to re	ad as follows:
15	" <u>"</u> In	ternational competitiveness" means that seventy-five
16	per cent	of students in the public schools perform on par on
17	standardi	zed examinations with students in the ten countries
18	with the	highest scores in reading, writing, mathematics, and
19	science."	
20	SECT	TION 5. Section 302A-201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended t	o read as follows:

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1	"\$302A-201 Statewide performance standards. (a) The		
2	board shall establish statewide performance standards and the		
3	means to assess the standards based upon the recommendations in		
4	the final report of the performance standards commission		
5	established pursuant to Act 334, Session Laws of Hawaii 1991;		
6	provided that the board may review and modify the performance		
7	standards, as the board deems necessary, to reflect the needs of		
8	public school students and educational goals adopted by the		
9	board.		
10	(b) The board shall expand statewide performance standards		
11	to enable students to achieve international competitiveness		
12	under a schedule of progress to be determined by the board;		
13	provided that students in the public schools shall achieve		
14	international competitiveness within seven years of the		
15	effective date of Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2013; and		
16	provided further that no well-defined group of students in the		
17	public schools, as determined by the board, shall perform at		
18	levels below one standard deviation of mean of all students.		
19	(c) Every public school shall administer tests in an		
20	electronic format for the core courses of reading, writing,		
21	mathematics, and science to track student progress towards		
22	achieving international competitiveness."		

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1 SECTION 6. Section 302A-624, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 2 3 The salary schedule for all teachers of the department shall be negotiated pursuant to section 89-9[-]; 4 provided that the starting salaries of teachers shall be based 5 6 upon levels of educational attainment; and provided further that 7 the starting salaries of teachers at schools whose students do 8 not meet statewide performance standards may be set at a higher 9 level than the starting salaries of teachers at schools whose **10** students meet statewide performance standards." 11 SECTION 7. Section 302A-1128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 12 "§302A-1128 Department powers and duties. The department 13 14 shall have entire charge and control and be responsible for the 15 conduct of all affairs pertaining to public instruction in the 16 public schools the department establishes and operates, **17** including operating and maintaining the capital improvement and repair and maintenance programs for department and school 18 facilities[-], and conducting unannounced, random site visits at 19 20 each public school to inspect the school's financial administration and operations. The department may establish and 21 22 maintain schools for secular instruction at such places and for

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- 1 such terms as in its discretion it may deem advisable and the
- 2 funds at its disposal may permit. The schools may include high
- 3 schools, kindergarten schools, schools or classes for early
- 4 education, boarding schools, Hawaiian language medium education
- 5 schools, and evening and day schools. The department may also
- 6 maintain classes for technical and other instruction in any
- 7 school where there may not be pupils sufficient in number to
- 8 justify the establishment of separate schools for these
- 9 purposes."
- 10 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
- 13 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 14 year 2014-2015 for additional funding for each public school to
- 15 increase community involvement.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 17 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015,
- 21 and shall apply beginning with the 2015-2016 school year;
- 22 provided that Section 8 shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
