## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUACULTURE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that most of the fish 2 consumed in the United States is imported. Of all products imported in the country, the value of imported seafood is second 3 4 only to petroleum. As supplies of fish stock continue to be 5 depleted, aquaculture represents an alternative means to meet 6 the demand for fish products. 7 The legislature further finds that land-based aquaculture 8 farming, as distinguished from ocean-based aquaculture farming, 9 is a growing industry in Hawaii. Land-based aguaculture 10 includes aquacultural activities in controlled environments such 11 as ponds, tanks, and aquaponics structures. **12** The purpose of this Act is to provide organizational 13 structure and support to the aquaculture industry by engaging 14 the department of agriculture to facilitate land-based

aquaculture farming on lands exceeding three acres in area and

classified as agricultural.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "\$141- Aquaculture farming. (a) Notwithstanding 5 chapter 180 or any other law to the contrary, the department of 6 agriculture shall facilitate land-based aquaculture farming on 7 land that: 8 (1) Exceeds three acres in area; and 9 (2) Is placed within an agricultural district pursuant to 10 section 205-2. 11 (b) For the purposes of this section: 12 "Land-based aquaculture" means all aquaculture activities, 13 as defined in section 219-2, when carried out on land by a 14 qualified aquaculturist. The term shall not include ocean-based 15 aquaculture. 16 "Qualified aquaculturist" shall have the same meaning as 17 defined in section 219-2." 18 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
