#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL SAFETY TASK FORCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that while allowing 2 school doors to be locked is one step that can be taken to help 3 secure our classrooms during a school shooting, concerns remain 4 regarding cost and compliance with the fire code. The 5 legislature additionally acknowledges that locking doors and 6 other security measures were not sufficient to stop the 2012 7 school shooting in Newtown, Connecticut. In the wake of that 8 and other tragedies, the State should examine ways to increase 9 school security without waiting until a similar tragedy at one 10 of our schools pushes us to take action. 11 The purpose of this Act is to create a task force to 12 determine how to increase safety in our schools. 13 SECTION 2. (a) There shall be established a task force that shall, at a minimum: 14 15 Examine the need for safety improvements in Hawaii's (1) 16 public and private schools; Determine whether the Hawaii Revised Statutes should 17 (2)
